

## **Downs Infant School**

## PE Funding Report 2023-24

This report outlines the funding received by the school in the academic year 2023-2024, and how it has been spent or planned to be spent to develop the PE and sport activities Downs Infant School already offers and engage pupils in more regular physical activity.

The PE and sport premium should be spent to improve the following 5 key areas:

- 1. increasing all staff's confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE and sport
- 2. increasing engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity and sport
- 3. raising the profile of PE and sport across the school, to support whole school improvement
- 4. offer a broader and more equal experience of a range of sports and physical activities to all pupils
- 5. increase participation in competitive sport

All children and young people should live healthy active lives. The UK Chief Medical Officers recommend that all children and young people should take part in moderate to vigorous intensity physical activity for at least 60 minutes every day. Children with special educational needs and disabilities should take part in 20 minutes of daily activity.

## Review of last year's (2022-2023) spend and key achievements

In 2022-23 the school received £18,395 of sports funding. There was a carry forward of £8,475.36 from the previous year. Total spent in year 2022-23 £3,795.01

## Key priorities and planning for this year's (2023-2024) spend

In 2023-2024 the school has received £19,240.01 sports funding. There is a carry forward from last year of £25,630.99
