#### What is continuous provision?

 This is when children learn and play in the absence of an adult. They learn to access resources independently and these are continuously available to them in the environment. The learning environment will therefore change as the year progresses to reflect their changing needs. Some learning is based around a topic theme such as "I'm a miracle" but sometimes the play and learning, particularly within the continuous provision, may not look topic based or 'picture perfect' as we believe that good quality play often comes from children's real life experiences. For example, children can all play 'homes' as they all have one, but playing 'rocket ships' is beyond their experiences and can limit the play and language for some children.
