Therefore, we welcome applications from under-represented groups.

The commitment we expect from our Governing Body involves up to six evening meetings a year, a variable number of day time visits to the school to explore specific issues and report back to fellow governors, plus a commitment to attend governor training. The successful candidate will be appointed for a four year term.
