

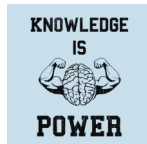

KEEPING SAFE

Please may I remind you of a few things about our school grounds that are in place to keep our pupils safe.



You can help us to do this by remembering to drive and park safely around the school grounds—park away from school and stride if you can. Be respectful of the neighbours in our community by not blocking driveways and do not park on the yellow zig zags on Gloucester Road or on the school driveway off Marlborough Road.

We are also operate a 'smoke free gates' policy which means there is no smoking anywhere on our school grounds, including the pathways between buildings and we politely request that you wait until you are out of view of our pupils before you 'light up' - this includes vaping.



Finally, a reminder that dogs are not to be brought onto the school grounds, even being carried. They must not be tied to school railings either. Thank you for your cooperation in all of these matters.
