

STARTING RECEPTION

Starting reception is an important milestone in your child's life. We will do all we can to help them feel, welcome, safe and secure. We are aware that this is also a big step for you as parents. We value the input you, as parents, have already made in your child's education and we look forward to developing a partnership with you.

We slowly welcome the children into Reception as this is a big step for them and we want a smooth transition for you, your child and your family. You will be sent a letter regarding your child's start date and timings. For the 1st week we spend time getting to know your child and give them the opportunity to explore their environment and begin to make new friends.

PREPARING YOUR CHILD

Starting reception is a very exciting time for young children and together we can make it a happy time for them. Before starting reception, a member of staff from your child's class will come to your home. During this time, we will ask you to fill out our school paperwork, but this visit will allow you to ask any questions you may have.

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PARTNERSHIPS WITH PARENTS

Parents are children's first educators. The experiences and opportunities that you provide for your child will have an impact on their education. When parents and teachers work together, this will have an even bigger impact on their learning. We value our parent / carer partnership and we need you, to help make this most important time in your child's life, fun, exciting and engaging as possible.

We will:

- Hold learning workshops- you are able to sit at the back of your child's class and observe how lessons are taught.
- Keep you informed about the activities and learning experiences that your child will be taking part in.
- ✓ Hold 2 parent's evenings each year to discuss your child's progress.



HOW YOU CAN HELP

- Please ensure you are on time when dropping off and collecting your child from reception.
- If you are late for any reason, please go to the main school office.
- Please tell a member of staff if someone different is collecting your child from reception. Please ensure they have the password. Without a password your child will not be allowed to leave the School. This is for their safety.
- Your child must be brought into school and collected by a person over the age of 16 years.

ABSENCE OR ILLNESS OR CHANGE OF ADDRESS

Contact the main school office if:

- Your child is sick and cannot attend school (If your child has had sickness or diarrhoea, please keep them at home for 48 hours after their last period of sickness).
- You have changed address or contact number.
- Your child has a hospital or doctor's appointment.
- If your family is going on holiday during term time (please note term time absence will not be authorised).

CLOTHING AND PERSONAL ITEMS

- Children wear school uniform in reception (please read out Induction for Parents document for more information).
- Please supply a bag full of spare clothes, pants and socks. If your child has an accident or gets muddy while playing outside, they will need to be changed into dry clothes. This bag can stay on your child's peg.
- Please do not allow your child to bring in toys from home, as they can get lost or broken.
- Finally, please label every item that your child brings into nursery with their name: shoes, bags, clothes, sunhats, gloves, scarves and water bottles.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

PARENT PAY

We are a cashless school. When your child starts nursery/reception, you will receive a Parent Pay letter with your username and password. We use this system throughout the school. By using this system, you will be able to pay for your nursery donation and for school trips.

SCHOOL MEALS AND SNACKS

As a school we provide the children with free milk and fruit (milk is provided until they are 5). You do not need to provide your child with extra food. Children are provided with free hot school meals from Reception to Year 2. You are able to book their meals through parent pay.

We offer a meat or a vegetarian option, we do not offer halal option. If you wish for your child to have a packed lunch, then you are welcome to provide one, however please ensure it is a healthy lunch. We are a nut free school so please do not add nuts into your child's lunchbox



CURRICULUM

The Department for Education have made changes to the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile, which we follow at Drove Primary School. The changes were implemented from September 2021. The key objectives are to improve the outcomes for all children particularly in language and literacy.
