





SAFEGUARDING/OUTREACH

Operation Encompass - Lancashire Schools

Operation Encompass is a safeguarding initiative that ensures schools receive timely information about children involved in domestic abuse incidents, enabling them to provide necessary support.

Operation Encompass is a police and education confidential partnership aimed at supporting children and young people who have been exposed to domestic abuse. Under this initiative, police forces are required to notify a child's school or early years provider the next school day after attending an incident of domestic abuse where children are present.
