We will be focussing on writing sentences including capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Our year 2 children will explore questions. Do you know anything about wolves? Key Vocabulary:	<u>Maths</u> Y1 and Y2 National Curriculum Objectives This term we will focus on place value, addition and subtraction, as well as shape, space and measure. The children will continue to use our maths characters to further develop their reasoning skills and engage in daily maths mastery sessions and early bird maths. They will identify and name common plants and trees, explore the different parts of a plant, and observe how plants change as they grow. Children will have opportunities to plant seeds, make observations, and develop their scientific skills by asking questions, making predictions and recording what they discover
<u>History</u> Titanic The children will be learning all about the Titanic. We will learn about the similarities and differences between life in 1912 and today. We will look at the causes of the disaster and how technological changes mean this wouldn't happen today. We will be writing like Historians. We will use World maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries. Have you visited any other countries in the UK? <u>Religious Education</u> Christianity – God Why do Christians say that God is the 'father'? We will be learning about Christian beliefs about God. We will listen to The Lord's Prayer and The Prodigal Son and think about what they tell Christians about God and how he treats people.
