Focus: Programming – Sequence in music Using Scratch, the children will introduced to a range of motion, sound and event blocks which they use to create their own programs, featuring sequences.

Mathematics: Daily mathematics lesson will cover: Place value including Roman Numerals, counting including negative numbers, fractions, decimals and division, position and direction, 2D shape and position, multiplication (statistics, measures, money), times tables, written multiplication, addition and subtraction (statistics).
