

**English:** Daily English lesson (Y3 & Y4 National Curriculum Objectives)

**Focused Text:**

**Summer 1: Romans on the Rampage (Jeremy Strong)**

This text will be linked to our Roman Topic. The children will build up to writing advice to the main character, and also creating a newspaper report.

**Summer 2:**

**Non-fiction - Horrible Histories - Rotten Romans.**

We shall build up to writing a non-chronological report about the Romans.

**Computing:**

**Focus:** Video Production

The children will be creating their own short video clip. They will learn to capture, edit and manipulate the video.

**French**

**Focus: Food, feelings and jungle animals**

The children will learn to ask for breakfast foods, describe everyday illnesses and learn names for jungle animals.

**Art: 3D sculpture**

**Skills: Printing**

We are looking at artists famous for printing and using their work as a stimulus to create our own designs.

Year 3: number, shape, time and statistics following the Red Rose Scheme.

Year 4: Number, fractions, shape and statistics.

**Topic: What the Romans did for us**
