At Duke Street Primary we acknowledge the importance of stories in every child's life. Our reading challenge has been designed to encourage all children and families to spend time reading some of the many of the greatly loved stories of our rich literacy heritage.

This list is not an exhaustive one and we recognise that there will be some books not on which both children and adults think should be; however do not let the omission of them deter you from reading them!

The books on this list can be read by the children independently, as part of our class novels or aloud by family and friends at home. Indeed, it would be encouraging to hear how families have read some of the books on the list as bedtime stories.

The challenge of this programme is that a child is able to read, or has read to them, all 100 books on the list by the time they leave year 6.

Where the book title listed is a series e.g. Mr Men and Little Miss, it is expected that the children will read one from it.

For each of the books on the list sign and date when read. When a child achieves certain markers they will be eligible to receive a certificate to recognise the significant milestone reached:

Bronze: 25 Books

Silver: 50 Books

Gold: 75 Books
