Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo Spellings will be sent home weekly. Home reading will continue and be monitored.

Guided reading will take place each morning.

Computing: Computer networks: we will develop our understanding of computer systems and how information is transferred between systems and devices. Work collaboratively on a online project. **Vector drawing**-we will find out that vector images are made up of shapes. They will learn how to use the different drawing tools and how images are created in layers. **Health, wellbeing & lifestyle**- healthy use of technology. Impact this can have on our lives.

Art:

Painting: We will be learning about famous artists and the skills used to create their masterpieces with the end goal being replicating their masterpieces using similar materials and techniques.

Printing: Keeping in theme with Christmas, we will take the opportunity to cover some of the learning and skills that were missed during forced closure.
