**English:** This term we will focus on reading an adaptation of **Beowulf by Michael Morpurgo**. We will look at his use of language and its impact on the reader. The children will then write a new adventure for the hero in the style of Morpurgo.

We will also look at an adaptation of **Shakespeare's Macbeth**. The children will be engrossed in the tragedy of the events in the story. They will do lots of incidental writing based on the characters.

**Mathematics:** Daily mathematics lesson

(Y5 & Y6 National Curriculum Objectives)

We will consolidate our previous learning on Place Value and the four operations in Mathematics.

We will learn about Fractions, Decimals and Percentages. We will cover Statistics, Measures and Algebra (Year 6). We will have a problem solving focus week on finding all possibilities to a range of maths problems.

**Early Bird Maths** continues every morning from 8:45 to improve arithmetic skills. These sessions are having a valuable impact on confidence and accuracy.

# **Computing:** Focus:

- 1: repetition in games (scratch online) We will use Scratch Coding Software to explore using repetition functions in games.
- 2: selection in quizzes (scratch online)
  We will use Scratch to create quizzes and use selection
  functions to display multiple choice options and answers.

## Science:

This term, our topic will be Animals Including Humans. We will learn all about the circulatory system, the functions of the blood, how it travels around the body and the heart. We will then move on to looking at healthy diets and lifestyles and how what we consume and how we exercise affects of physical health.

# **Curriculum Drivers:**

We are having a whole-school focus on improving our learning behaviours to maximise our potential.

## Art

This term, we will immerse ourselves in the artistic medium of sculpture, focussing on the local artist Antony Gormley. We will explore different materials to create brutalist sculptures and place these in and around the school environment highlighting the clash between man and nature.

#### DT

# History

We will be learning about the Vikings in our next History unit. We will focus on invasions and all that this entails. This will involve looking at maps of the UK which will link well with our learning in Geography about the United Kingdom!

# Geography

We will explore locational knowledge of England and learn all about fieldwork. Children will locate different towns, cities and regions and look at human and physical geography of the United Kingdom.

#### RE:

**Islam:** What is Hajj and why is it important to Muslims?

We will reflect on the personal journey a Muslim will make both physically and spiritually and focus on the five pillars of Islam and how this impacts the life of Muslims.
