

September 2024	Applications open.			
31 October 2024	Closing date for applications.			
1 March 2025	National offer day. Offers are made by the Local Authority admissions team.			
From 22nd March 2025	Reallocation day. You can ask for your child's name to be added to a school waiting list for the 2023/24 academic year.			
From April 2025	The transition process begins, and additional visits and parental opportunities are shared.			
Friday 4th July 2025	Induction day			
Friday 29th August 2025	Additional Transition visit
