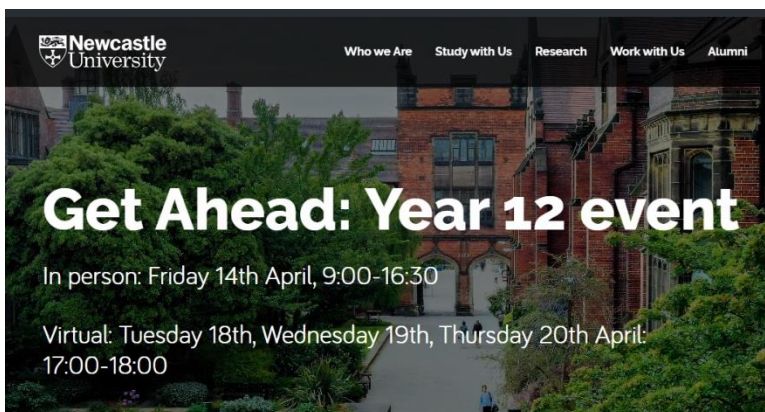

ensure our students have as much quality information so that they **make informed decisions** about their future. During the event students were tasked to speak to and collect information from at least 8 different providers.



VetCam 2023 - Introduction to Veterinary Medicine at Cambridge University – Year 11 and Year 12 students

Monday 3rd, Tuesday 4th and Wednesday 5th April 2023

Following the successful courses held here in recent years we are holding another two-and-a-half-day residential programme for Year 11 and 12 students interested in applying to study Veterinary Medicine at Cambridge University.

The course will take place on Monday 3rd, Tuesday 4th and Wednesday 5th April 2023.

We would be grateful if, on our behalf, you could forward this information to those students who have expressed an interest in studying Veterinary Medicine. To avoid disappointment, please stress to them that early booking is essential.

The programme will include visits to both the pre-clinical and clinical departments to give a taste of the course, insight into life at a Cambridge college, and a chance to meet staff and current students. Places will be limited to 130 on first-come-first-served basis, and it would be sensible to encourage only likely A/A*-grade candidates to attend. Please note that Chemistry A level (or equivalent) is mandatory, and we strongly recommend two other science subjects, normally Biology, Physics or Maths.

The **2023 course fee will be £280** for the all-inclusive two-and-a-half-day course; this fee covers all costs whilst attendees are in Cambridge. Attendees will be staying in St Catharine's College in single student rooms with shared bathrooms.

It is important to emphasise that attending this course, or other open days at Cambridge, while useful for many pupils to make their decisions about university choices, does not confer any advantage in the application process.

T Levels - Myth of the month

'You need to have achieved GCSE English and maths to be able to undertake a T Level'

Although some T Level providers may have entry requirements that stipulate that English and/or maths should be achieved prior to the T Level, it is not an official requirement of T Levels.

Some providers may suggest that the student undertakes the T Level transition programme prior to commencing the full T Level so that they can develop their skills and gain their English and maths. If English and maths are not held at grade 4 or above, the T Level provider will support the student to achieve these during their programme.

How to search and apply for T Levels

Around 160 schools and colleges already offer T Levels and many more will start offering them in September this year.

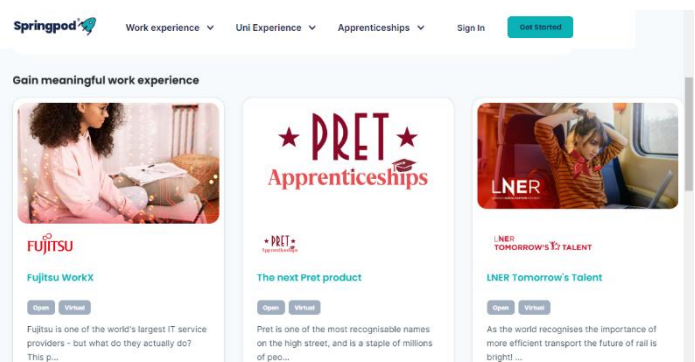
