5. Labia.

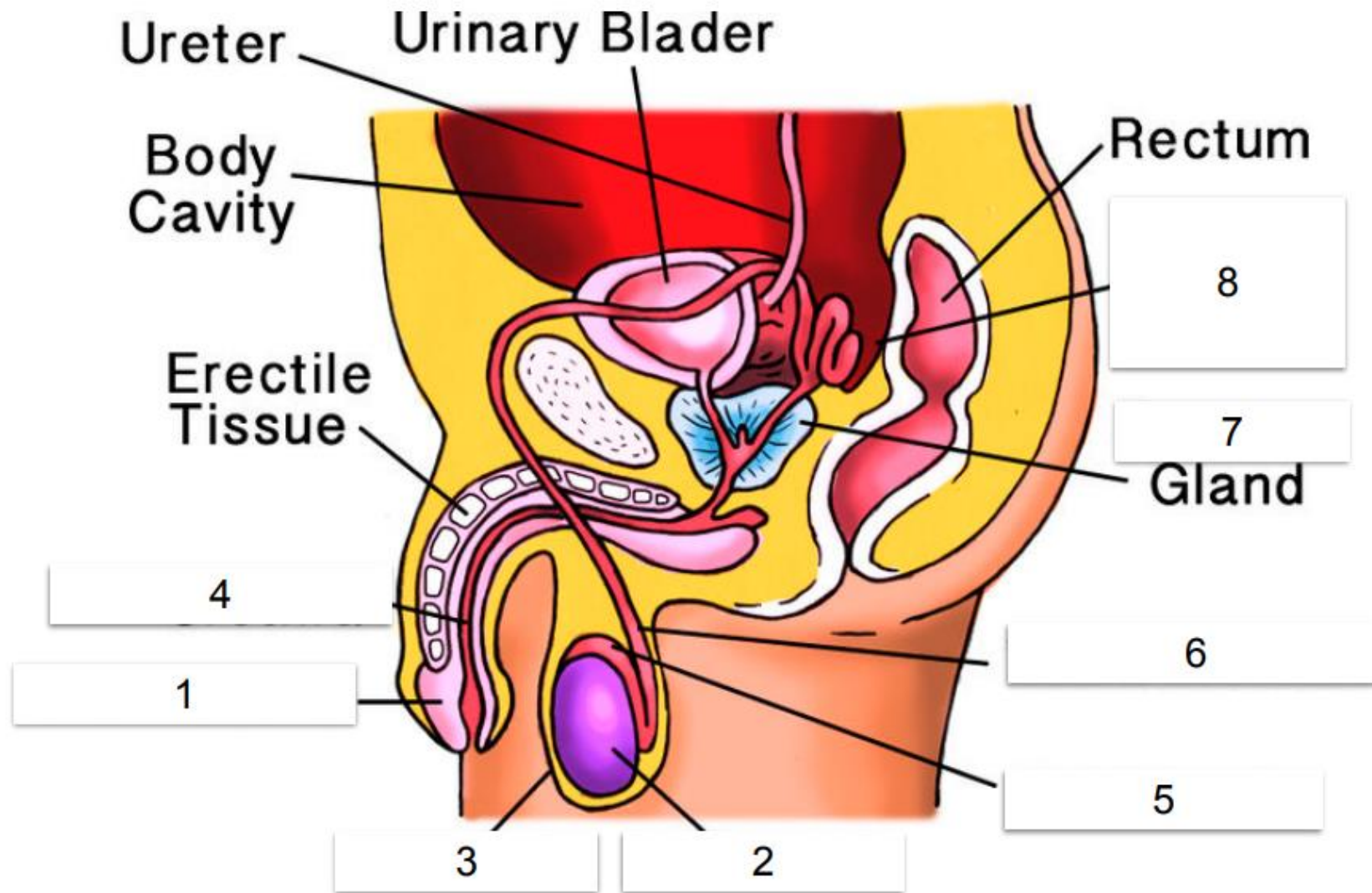
E. Stores and matures male sperm.

7. Blastocyst.

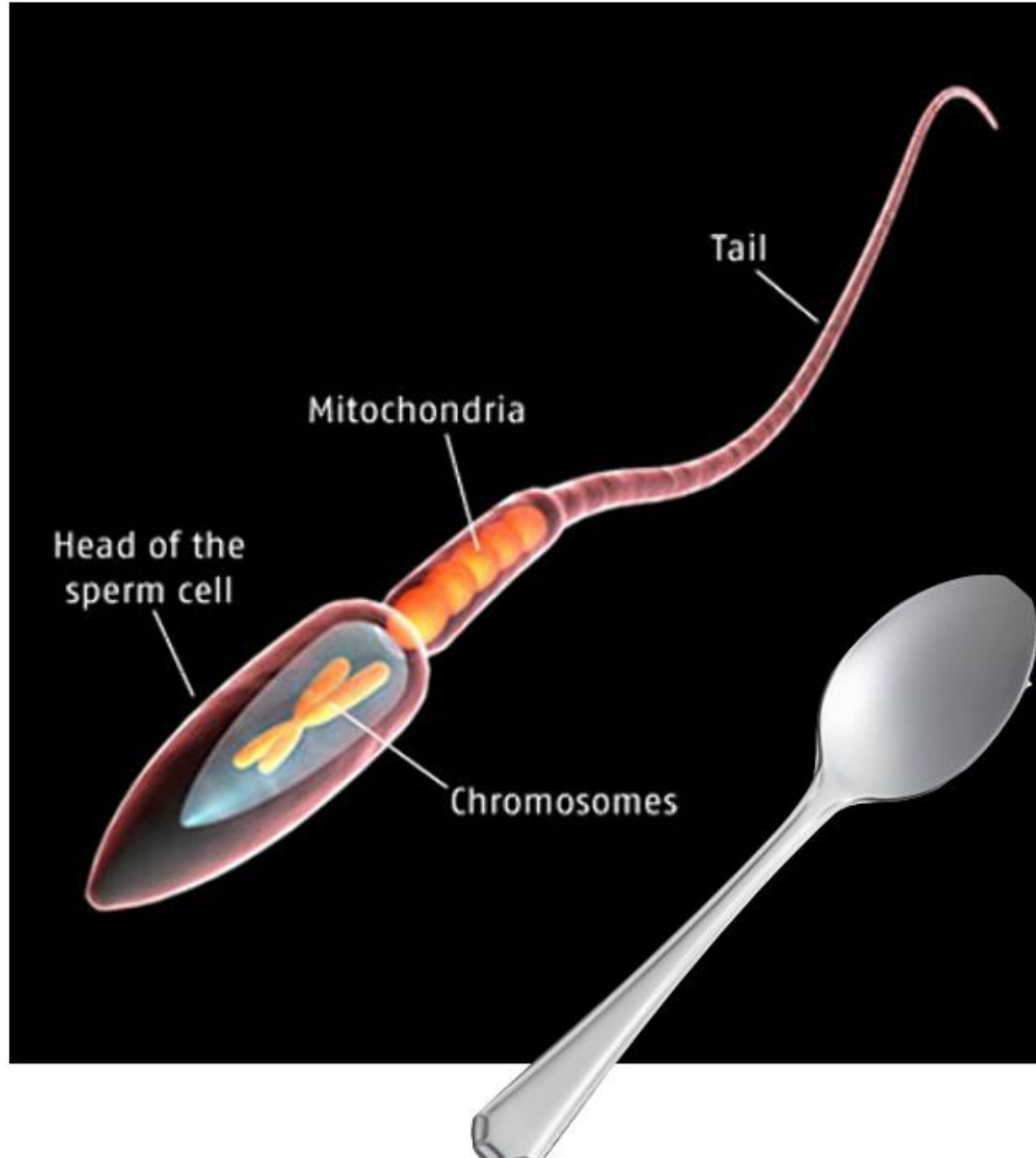
G. Surrounds and protect the clitoris and vagina.



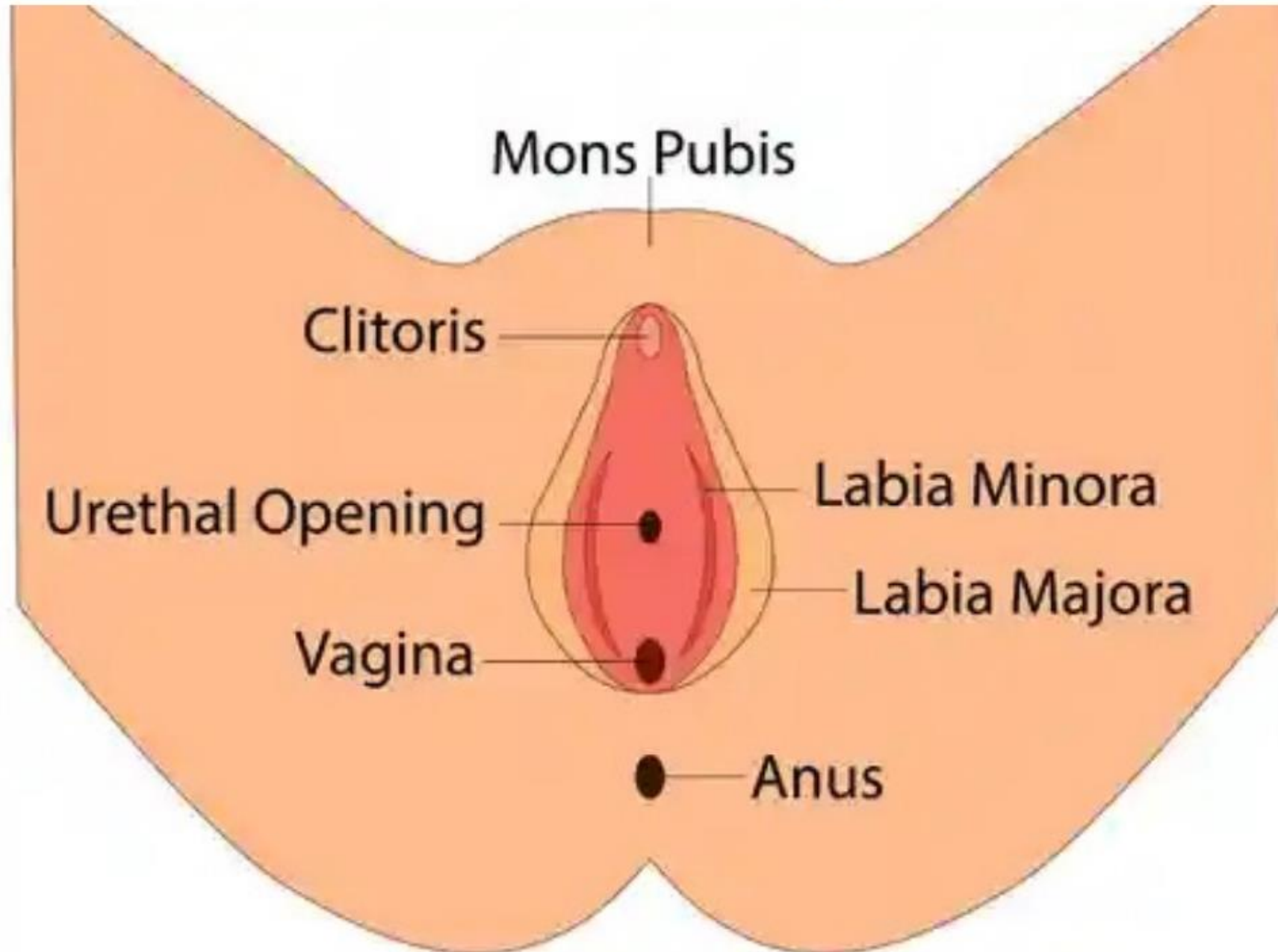

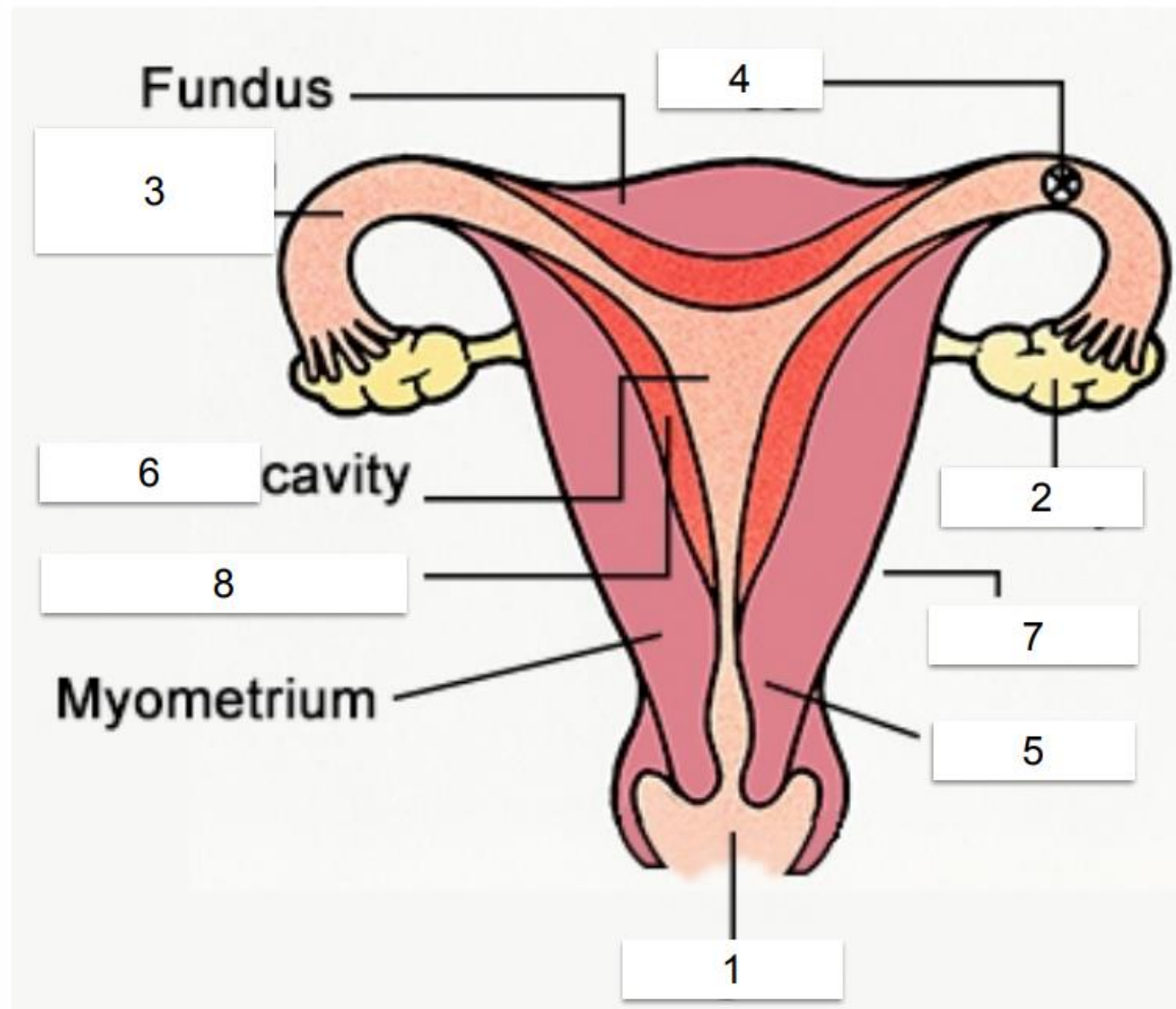
# Sperm Facts

- Sperm is the smallest cell in the human body.
- Concentration of spermatozoa should be at least 20 million per ml.
- Average volume of semen 5ml.
- In human beings each ejaculation contains normally 200 to 300 million sperm.
- A typical ejaculation measures about a teaspoon, but it contains 200 million sperm. Those cells, laid end to end, would stretch for six miles.
- At least 75 per cent of the spermatozoa should be alive.
- Sperm is ejaculated at around 28mph.

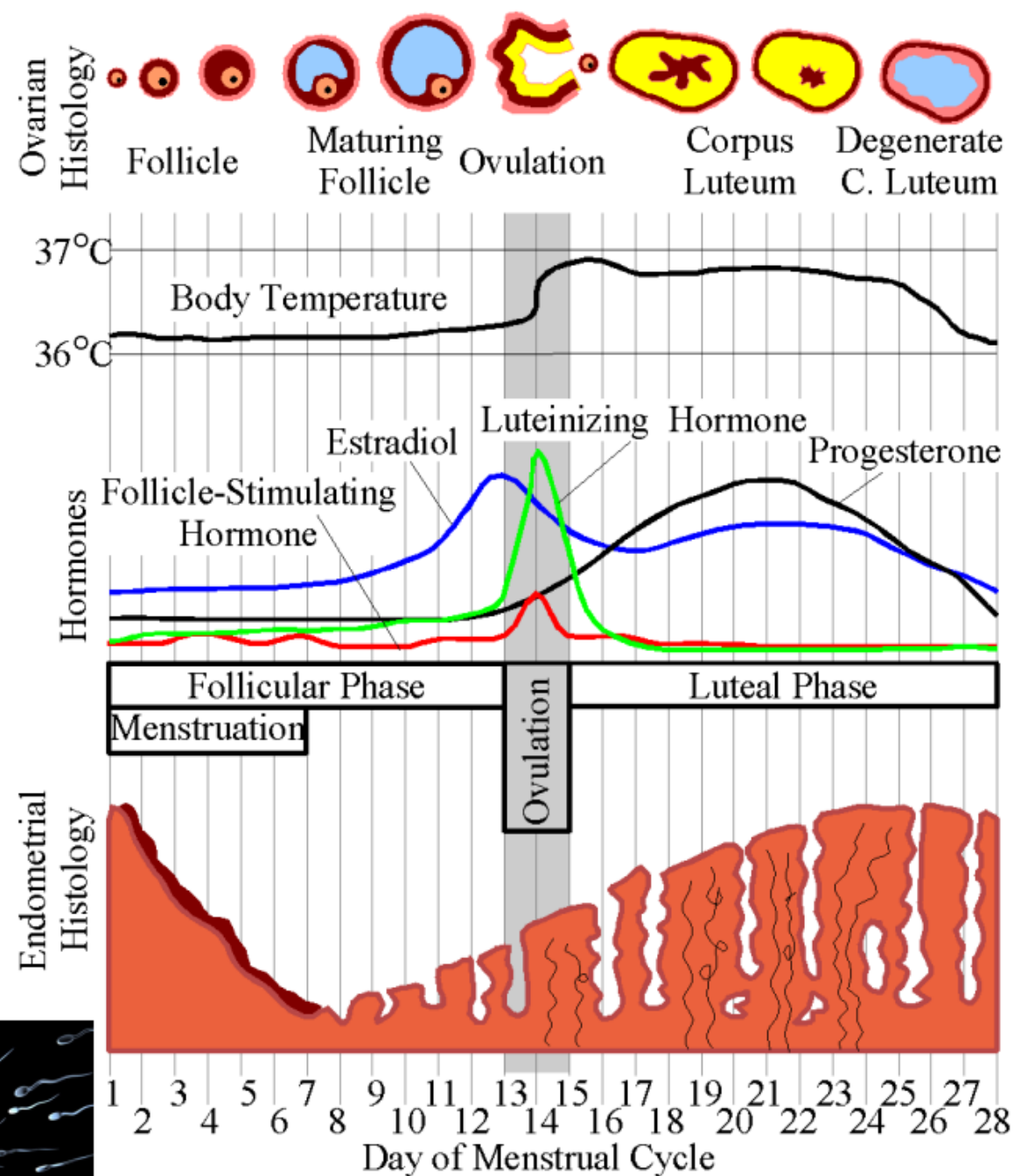
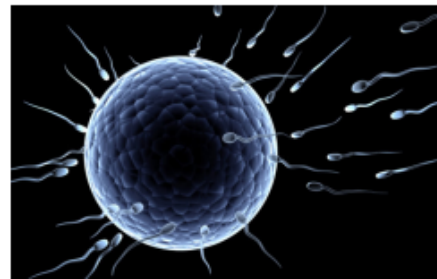
Female Reproductive Organs

- The Brain tell the body to release different hormones.

- A Follicle develops and is released.

- The Uterus swells with blood to receive a fertilised egg.

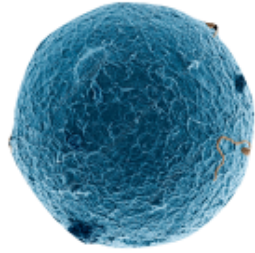
- For fertilisation to occur, the male sperm must reach the egg in the fallopian tubes within 24 hours of ovulation.



(Average values. Durations and values may differ between different females or different cycles.)

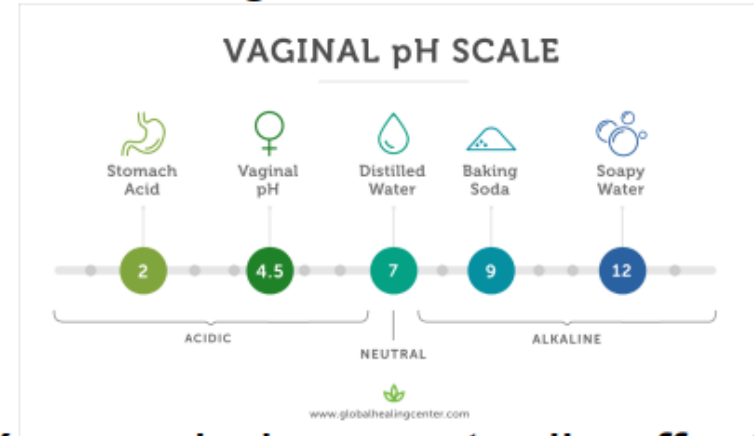
# Amazing Facts

- Your uterus is home to the largest human cell in the entire body – the egg. It is the only cell that can be seen with the naked eye, and it's responsible for the continuation of the human race.



- As a woman, you are born with your entire egg supply – around two million eggs. Less than 500 of these are released in the form of a period, and a lucky few may go on to be fertilised and become children.

- The Lactobacillus bacteria are the species that are generally found in the vagina in healthy females. These bacteria secrete lactic acid that helps maintain the pH of the vagina at 4.5 and helps keep the vagina clean.



- Your period can actually affect the way your voice sounds. Say what?! Vaginal cells are quite similar to the cells in your larynx, and both sets of cells are affected by hormonal changes.

# Sex & The Law.

- It is legal for anyone age 16 and over to engage in sexual activity with persons of the same or opposite sex.
- It is assumed you have the capacity to consent. By that age you will generally have the knowledge & understanding to appreciate what sexual activity is, and any reasonable foreseeable consequences of that activity.
- For someone to agree to sexual activity they must be able to do so freely and with understanding.

# Sex & The Law.

Sex that is penetration with a penis is always rape when the person it is happening to:

- Any person under the age of 13 can't consent to any sexual activity. Rape or Sexual assault will have taken place.
- Does not consent at the time.
- Is too drunk or drugged or unwell to consent.
- Has severe learning disabilities or other mental disorders that makes them unable to understand enough to consent.

Sexual assault is classed equally as serious as rape, with a maximum jail sentence of 25 years.
