Dear Parents and Carers,

I wrote to you in July 2021 with a sense of hope that things would improve in the year ahead and that we would start to recover from the most difficult issues caused by the pandemic. In truth, it has been an equally complicated year with new challenges for all members of our school community. As ever though, that has been balanced by great success and significant achievement. We were nationally praised for our ethical approach to GCSE and A Level examination results, with our students achieving real success in August 2021. We hope to replicate that again this year, with a return to traditional results days and students sitting external examinations for the first time in two years. Students have been supportive of others and staff have adapted to each new challenge. Those challenges have included on site testing, the use of face coverings for fixed periods, a new Public Health referral system for outbreaks and vaccinations, the most intensive wave of the pandemic to date and the return of a fully functioning school with no protective bubbles. It has been a challenging year and, hopefully, 2022-23 will offer an additional step towards a more normal school year.

We are very proud of our students' achievements in 2021-22 and that so many have accessed new opportunities. We have welcomed parents and carers back into the school via Parent Information Evenings (hosting 13 separate events across the year) and have reintroduced a full programme of music, sport, and extra-curricular activities. Our students have achieved success in a wide range of different fields, and we are very proud of them. We have rewarded them for their commitment to social justice and public service and for taking important steps in their personal development, regardless of their starting points. We have thought carefully about relationship and sex education and have celebrated the increased diversity of our school community. In simple terms, we have tried our hardest with every new challenge and have learned and adapted quickly when entering unknown territory. At the time of writing, it is also good to be able to report that there are no current Department for Education updates that we have been asked to share with parents and carers and, hopefully, there will be time for a new Education Secretary to gain experience and understand the needs and strengths of all schools.

There have been several staffing changes for September 2022 that we would also like to share with you:

# Staffing for September 2022

We have a very experienced teaching staff at Durham Johnston and our teachers tend to dedicate their careers to the school. They are currently planning very carefully to ensure that students and their families have a clear sense of the subject content, assessment and extension work that they will prioritise in September.

We are also saying goodbye to a number of very experienced staff members in Mr McArdle (Assistant Headteacher, Geography & Former Head of 6<sup>th</sup> Form)), Miss Owen (Year Leader & Geography), Dr Bolton (Biology, 2<sup>nd</sup> in Science Department) and Mr Wells (Subject Leader for RE). Collectively, they have been loyal members of staff and have contributed to the success of large numbers of students.

Mr McArdle joined the school in 2001, Miss Owen in 1997 (starting as Year Leader in 2003), Dr Bolton in 2007 and Mr Wells in 2012. We are also saying goodbye to Mr Proudfoot (Maths) who joined the school in 2021.

There have been a number of changes in terms of staffing for September 2022, with serving staff taking on additional roles and new appointments, and teachers joining us for the new academic year. Those appointments are:

# The Year Ahead for each individual year group, September 2022 to July 2023

We are very mindful that it has been a difficult year for our students. We are keen to celebrate success, to offer more support to each year group and to make lessons as engaging and well taught as possible. We will also focus very strongly on our ethos and will ensure that all members of our school community are treated respectfully, with kindness and fairly. The following information regarding safeguarding, communication, the use of mobile phones and uniform should offer a clear understanding of both school and parental responsibilities when it comes to each of these important areas of school life. We are a community with high expectations, and it is important that we all work together positively.

#### Safeguarding & Speaking Up

Mr Weaver, Assistant Headteacher, is our Designated Safeguarding Lead. All members of the school are safeguarding trained, with the school's Leadership Team and Year Leaders having enhanced training experience. We take our commitments very seriously and have a zero-tolerance policy towards any form of prejudicial behaviour or harassment. If any student is worried about an issue, they should speak with their Year Leader or a member of the school leadership team. The list of safeguarding staff can also be found in each student's organiser and on the school website. We encourage students to speak up and, if they observe someone else in difficult circumstances, to never be a bystander. **If you have any safeguarding concerns always contact the school. We will treat all concerns seriously, will respect confidentiality where possible and will always investigate thoroughly.** 

Students will make mistakes and we will prioritise educating those that do and offering opportunities to apologise and put things right, but we will not accept anyone being made to feel deliberately uncomfortable by others. We have a zero-tolerance attitude towards bullying and a commitment to educate all students so that they can avoid dangerous situations. We also take our time to understand each unique situation and would encourage parents and carers not to take everything that they are told at home at face value. Please engage with the school positively and do not rush to judgement.

#### **School Communication**

We will continue to offer regular weekly updates and additional guidance if appropriate. The weekly Friday bulletin will return as of September, outlining extracurricular opportunities and celebrating student success across the school. Please write to the school with any new email addresses and telephone numbers so that you can keep up to date with what is happening in school.

If you need to contact the school, please be aware that teachers are unavailable between 8.20 a.m. and 3.00 p.m. each day and cannot easily respond to telephone calls or emails. We are always happy to communicate with parents and carers if there is an issue or significant development, but it is important to note that school staff will be working with students before and after those times too. They teach, meet with and safeguard students, attend meetings and plan. We always try to respond to any query within 3 working days, as is common in most professional organisations. Parents or carers should never arrive at school expecting to see a staff member without a prearranged appointment. Parents and carers doing so will be asked to leave and to arrange an appointment, if appropriate, at a later date and time. Parents or carers should never demand immediate action or behave in an aggressive or threatening manner. We will limit interaction with any parent or carers conducting themselves in this way.

If you have any concerns regarding a safeguarding issue, please make sure that reception staff are aware, and we will always act very quickly.

#### Mobile Phones, Use of Social Media & Positive Behaviour

Our rules regarding mobile phone are very simple. They are not allowed to be used, seen, or heard anywhere on the school site or at any point during the school day. Students do not have a right to use their mobile phones on the school site. Any student failing to follow this very clear rule will have their phone confiscated and a letter will be sent home explaining our concern. School provides an opportunity for respite from constant communication and allows student to talk and interact in person. To avoid confusion there are some other very simple rules regarding mobile phones, communication and social media use:

- No student has permission to film or record any other member of the school community. Any student doing so will rightly be sanctioned.
- Filming or recording other members of the school community without their consent is illegal.
- It is completely unacceptable to share pictures, request pictures or bully others online. The school has a zero-tolerance attitude to this form of behaviour.
- It is unacceptable to make unkind, illegal, or prejudicial comments about other people based upon their characteristics, background, or circumstances. Actions in or outside of school have consequences.
- As a parent, discuss how your child uses their phone and make sure that they do not behave in any of the unacceptable ways identified above. We emphasise that students should not be bystanders, nor should parents. There is national research into the dangers of letting children keep phones in their room overnight and it is always sensible to discuss what your child is looking at online. These are key parental responsibilities that will help you to safeguard your child.
- We will always offer support and guidance and regularly share E-Safety alerts via the school website. Please be aware that there are clear legal age limits on many forms of social media.
- Discuss the unrealistic nature of relationships and human bodies that are frequently shared online and use internet controls at home to protect your child from unregulated online content.
- Please also encourage your child to think carefully before making negative or thoughtless comments about other students via social media. Parents have responsibility for regulating social media use and for ensuring that there are consequences for offensive and unkind behaviour. As parents or carers, I would also encourage you to avoid negative, inaccurate, or provocative comments on social media about other members of the school community. We will continue to offer guidance to students about how to de-escalate situations and to avoid confrontation with others. It is important that parents support us in this and set a good example.
- Many of the negative situations that we address in school are caused by students making poor decisions in relation to social media use outside of school. Please act upon the advice given above and be aware that the behaviour of your child outside of school is a parental responsibility. We will offer support and guidance, but it is a parental choice as whether or not children use mobile phones and access social media.
- Please can I also encourage you to talk at home about the importance of behaving in a considerate and socially responsible manner on the way to and from school? Parents and carers are responsible for the behaviour of their children as they travel to and from school and it is important that you discuss how to treat other members of our local community respectfully.

If you are unsure about any of the above points or need help in order to safeguard your child and to understand the dangers of social media and how to keep your child safe online, please contact the school and we happily offer guidance and support.

#### Uniform and Piercings in September 2022

Our uniform is intended to be affordable, fair and to ensure that all students are members of the same, equal community. Please be aware that we have a selection of high-quality uniform available that has been donated by parents and carers. Please contact the school if you need any additional support with uniform.

For those of you who will be buying new items of uniform this summer, the uniform requirements are set out in our uniform policy at this link: <u>Uniform | Durham Johnston</u> <u>School</u>

We have emphasised to all students that uniform needs to be worn in a particular way, and we are committed to be fair and consistent in the language that we use in relation to uniform, and in how we apply the rules for all students. It is always important to review school uniform and we intend to discuss what students wear with representative groups from each year group as the year progresses. To avoid unnecessary issues that can impact upon student learning, please ensure that clothing is not made from stretch lycra or knitted fabrics. Uniform should be functional, appropriate, and allow all students to move around the school freely.

In addition to the above uniform advice, can I request that if your child is intending to get their ears pierced in the summer that they do so at the very beginning of the summer holiday, so that their piercings can heal and be safely removed for September? Piercings are not allowed in school and students are fully aware of this fact. These are small things, but our rules are very clear, and students should avoid decisions that will impact upon their ability to learn and progress when they return in September.

Form Tutors and senior staff will work with all students on a weekly basis to ensure that uniform issues are not limiting opportunities to be part of our community or to learn.

#### Positive Developments & School Improvement

We are very excited about the year ahead and are committed to improving the quality of education and opportunities for personal development for all students in the year ahead. The following overview outlines a selection of some of the key things that we have planned and areas for ongoing development:

- Our first Christmas Carol Service at the Cathedral since 2019.
- The return to a full programme of trips and visits including Pompeii, French and German study visits, our longstanding ski trip and cross curricular visits to the Cathedral and other sites of local importance.
- A full wellbeing week, including our Battlefields study visits and trips to Malaga and Howtown.
- The return of our long running Culture Festival.
- A new Relationship & Sexual Education curriculum with an information evening for parents and carers.
- Information evenings for all Year Groups, involving celebrations of student success.
- The return of our Art exhibition evening.
- The creation of a Durham Johnston 'world map' identifying the wide variety of backgrounds and countries that our students and families have joined the school from.
- An extensive alumni programme, where we invite parents, carers, and form students to share information about their jobs and careers and what they wish they had known at school.
- Support for local charities and organisations, as chosen by our House System.
- Increased support for all students with a special educational need.
- The reintroduction of form representatives and a new school council, or committee.


