What topics will I study?

In Year 10 you will study Urban Issues and Challenges, Physical Landscapes in the UK (rivers and coasts) and the Changing Economic World.

In Year 11 you will study The Living World (tropical rainforests and cold environments), The Challenge of Resource Management and The Challenge of Natural Hazards.

What fieldwork do we do?

You will complete two days of fieldwork (one on a physical geography topic and one on a human geography topic). Please note the locations are subject to change but we currently complete the following fieldwork.

- In the summer term of Year 10 we visit Hamsterley Forest and investigate the changes in the river system downstream, collecting different types of data in and around the river.
- In the autumn term of Year 11 we visit the centre of Durham and investigate the challenges facing our local urban area, collecting different types of data on the different social, economic and environmental challenges the city centre faces.

What type of careers can Geography GCSE lead to?
