## **ENGLISH - Y9 Transition**

GCSE English Language and Literature enable you to develop the skills to read, understand and analyse texts for your enjoyment, for your studies, but also to fully engage with the world around you. As well, they will help you to write clearly, coherently and accurately using a range of vocabulary and sentence structures. English Language focuses on enhancing your oral skills, too, making sure your voice is heard both in the classroom and in society.

GCSE English Language is an important foundation for many of the courses you may take in employment or further education, and a requirement for many university courses. It is a core subject, which helps you to develop your powers of self-expression and improve your reading and writing that are crucial to navigating life beyond the classroom.

You will have two English Language and two English Literature lessons a week.
