Practising being able to articulate why you've chosen the course you have, why it's the right course for you and why you think the subject is best of all is a good starting point for personal statement drafting.

Research what pre-admissions written assessment applies to your course and do as many practices as you can. Ask relevant subject staff at school to talk to you about this and look at what you produce. We can't always mark to an Oxbridge mark scheme but we can offer you support as experienced educators who've already graduated (at least once) in our chosen field.
