Governor Categories

Associate Governor – appointed by the Governing Body – Associate Governor do not have voting rights

Co-opted Governors - elected by the Governing Body

Headteacher – governor by virtue of office

Local Authority Governor – nominated by the LA and appointed by the Governing Body

Parent Governor – elected by the parent body

Staff Governor – elected by school staff

Student Associate Governors – two, Year 12 students - elected annually by their peers.. Student governors serve a one-year term of office but have no voting rights
