Wow, what a year! I almost don't know where to begin, other than to say a huge thank you to everyone who has supported, planned, organised, run & attended the PTSA events & activities this past year.

In terms of face to face events, we mothballed our small but firmly established PTSA in March of 2020, at our temporary school site in Wyke Gardens with just 480 students on roll. We returned 18 months later to a huge brand new site with state of the art facilities, and a school of over 750 students.

To say the past year has been a learning curve would be an understatement!

However, we hit the ground running thanks to everyone's concerted efforts to keep the PTSA ticking over in the background during those long pandemic lockdowns through our online Donut Days & Raffle sales and, most importantly, our collective desire to come back bigger and better than ever.

We started with a bang back in September as over 700 people attended our *Back to School BBQ* and we didn't look back, breaking fundraising record after fundraising record on our way though our most comprehensive schedule of events to date.

To put that into numbers, since we returned to having face to face events last September, we have had over 2,500 attendees across 9 events raising over £21,000 for the school!

Throughout the rest of this newsletter you will find reviews of our many events, details our fundraising totals & the projects we have funded for the school, as well as the events calendar for next term. I hope you enjoy the read, as it really brings home what an amazing school community we have here at Ealing Fields.

### School Projects Funded in 2021/22

Last year we delivered our biggest programme of school project funding to date, delivering £10,500 worth of grants for the following projects:

- £500 for a 3D Printer
- £5,000 for new Library Books
- £5,000 for the new Wellness Centre





For 2021 we have already made a £1,600 grant available for a new giant Chess & Draughts set that will be installed in the playground over the Summer holidays.

We will be discussing new funding opportunities with the school in the Autumn Term, including an exciting new Garden Project, and we hope to deliver in the region of £15,000 worth of funding to the school in 2022,


