#### Year 10 & 11 take to the stand – Witness for the Prosecution Theatre Trip


Year 10 & 11 Drama students stepped inside the magnificent surroundings of London County Hall to experience the intensity and drama of Agatha Christie's gripping story of justice, passion and betrayal in a unique courtroom setting. The students were not only audience members, but they were also theatre critics, as they were analysing and evaluating the design elements used by the designers and the vocal and physical skills used by the actors. There was certainly a lot to take in!

#### **Bush Theatre Workshop**

Following a performance and workshop at the Bush Theatre last academic year, we were kindly offered a follow-up workshop for both Year 10 and 11 Drama students. They specialised their workshop to fit what the students were currently working on in lessons. The professionals supported Year 10 to start thinking about a range of devising techniques and helped to support year 11 in working with a script. The Bush Theatre are also running a work experience program between  $7^{th} - 11^{th}$  July, which is tailored for students 14+, with an interest in the performing arts industry – get involved!

#### 1984 Drama Trip

GCSE Drama students were taken to see a production of 1984 at Richmond Theatre. One of the key themes in 1984 is surveillance and the notion that you are always being watched. This was brought to life the moment you walked into the theatre, with ACTUAL cameras capturing footage of us and displaying it on the screen! 1984 is the text that the GCSE students are studying and therefore they were very excited to see how it was staged and were taking notes for their own ideas which they will write about in their GCSE papers!





### **Christmas Concert**

Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> December brought us the fabulous Ealing Fields Christmas Concert. There were some wonderful performances from a variety of students! Kicking everything off was the long anticipated premier performance from the Samba Band. The students in Samba Band performed with unmatched enthusiasm, showcasing their well-honed stage presence and undeniable joy for playing! There were some brilliant acts from large ensembles (the entirety of Year 7 and Year 8) and some smaller ensembles, with a confident and polished solo performance from GCSE Music student Sophie O'Connor on the flute. A particular highlight was the song 'Shine' performed by Y7: a sweet performance about stars and light, sung in perfect harmony. Olive and Sienna, two Year 9 music scholars, were the narrative voices of the evening and made plenty of witty comments, adding a touch more magic to the concert. To top it all off, the end of the concert asked the parents to join in the fun (making for the largest ensemble yet!) singing O Come All Ye Faithful in excellent voice. What a wonderful end to such a delightful evening of musical and festive celebration!

### **3D Printing Club**

The 3D Printing Club introduced Year 7 and 8 students to the exciting world of 3D design and printing. The club emphasizes hands-on learning and independent skill development.

The culmination of the term's work is the 3D printing phase after the Christmas break. By then, students will have finalized their designs, ready for the exciting moment when their digital creations become tangible objects. This phase not only showcases their technical achievements but also celebrates their creativity and effort.

The club's self-paced format ensures that students can progress according to their abilities and interests. Each session provides a supportive environment where students can experiment, troubleshoot, and refine their designs. Peer discussions and guidance from the teacher further enhance the learning experience, fostering collaboration and a sense of community.

Beyond the immediate goal of creating 3D models, the skills gained in the club have real-world applications. From product design to gaming and animation, 3D modelling is a valuable tool across many fields. The club introduces these concepts in an engaging and accessible way, sparking interest in technology and design.

### **Aviation and NHS Workshops**

Students from year 9,10 and 11 have enjoyed a variety of speakers this term to help widen their horizons of different potential careers. 34 students attended a talk from an NHS General Practitioner who advised them on how to apply for Medicine and different routes into a medical career. Another 26 students attended an aviation workshop where students met with a British Airways Captain and a Valuations officer to understand different careers in the world of Aviation. A particular highlight was the Captain showing some of the places he's flown over and offering to mentor two of our students!

5 of our students have also been selected to take part in the Fantasy Wings programme where they meet with different speakers from across the world of aviation to learn more about routes into being a Pilot. Furthermore, many students have participated in online workshops regarding critical thinking, law, social work, consultancy and a huge variety of other careers.

### Community- The Mahaba Café

The Mahaba Café in Ealing is a social enterprise coffee shop that offers training opportunities to young people with special educational needs and disabilities. It was founded by Muriel Morgan Walckiers, a parent at Ealing Fields, and some other parents are also involved in the running of the café.
