We all of course loved our “free time lunch” and crammed as many Ealing Fields students into the frozen yoghurt place as was humanly possible! A highlight for Mrs Jones was seeing the students engage and cook paella in a cooking workshop later that day, the paella was delicious and even better that the students prepared our evening meal themselves, learning about different cooking techniques and sipping alcohol free sangria! 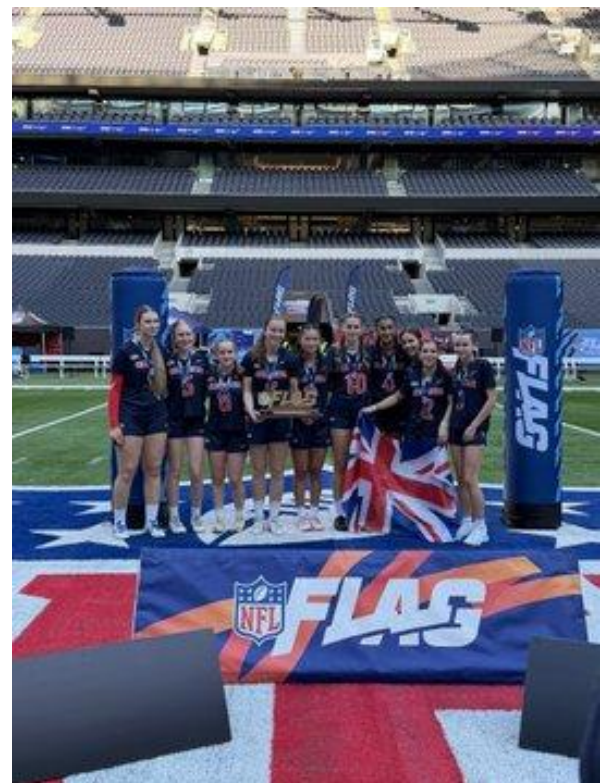
