



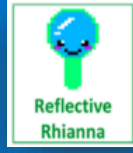

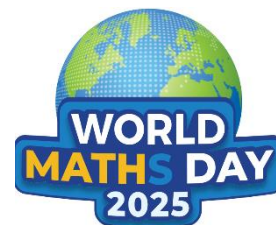
Football

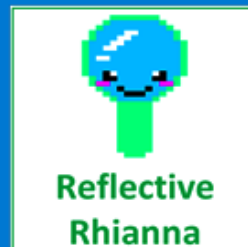
