# Earith Primary School: Curriculum Newsletter



**Class: Jeffers EYFS** Term: Autumn 1

## **Communication and Language:**

We will focus on the importance of listening and how we show others we are listening to them. We will have the opportunity to talk about ourselves and our families.

# Personal, Social and Emotional Development:

The focus will be on settling into school, making friendships and developing relationships. We will follow a unit of work focusing on beginning and belonging.

# **Literacy:**

We will be using the following texts:

Dan and Diesel by Charlotte Hudson, Hari's Box by Juliet Clare Bell, Here We Are by Oliver Jeffers, Tree by Britta Teckentrup and The Squirrels Who Squabbled by Rachel Bright

We will begin to learn the sounds that letters make and then learn how to blend the sounds into words.

## **Mathematics:**

We will be learning to subitise (recognising small groups without counting). We will learn about the composition of numbers as well as develop accurate counting strategies.

# **Understanding the World:**

We will find out about ourselves, including how we have changed from a baby to now. We will learn the names of different body parts and what we use them for. We will learn about different communities: the school community; our village and the

wider world. Finally, we will learn about the four seasons and that some trees lose their leaves during Autumn.

#### **Physical Development:**

We will be working on our fine motor skills, including developing scissor skills by snipping and cutting along a straight line. We will be working on our pencil control; using and developing using a tripod grip.

We will also be working on fundamental skills which include moving at different speeds and changing direction. We will then develop our throwing and catching skills and will use these skills when playing games.

We will use the balancing equipment, scooters and bikes each week.

# **Expressive Arts and Design:**

In art, we will be learning that primary colours can be mixed to make secondary colours. We will find primary and secondary colours in artworks by famous artists, such as Hundertwasser, Mondrian and Begum.

In music lessons, we will follow a unit called *Exploring Sounds*. In this, we will be exploring different types of sounds: those we can make with our voices; sounds in the environment and sounds we can make using instruments.

#### **Big Questions for the Half Term:**

Who am I?
What are the different seasons?
How can I create sound?
What happens when I mix colours?
