<u>Genies:</u> We have been reading the story "Sharing a shell", this story has really helped us practice good sharing and turn taking which we can sometimes find a bit tricky in Genie class. We've been doing lots of games, puzzles and taking turns using our voices at carpet time. Well done Genies!

<u>Pixies:</u> This week we have read What the Ladybird heard at the Seaside which has got us very excited for our Tour Bus and Beach trip on Monday! In Phonics our new sound was th and in Maths we have been ordering numbers to 5.

Sprites: This week Sprites enjoyed their first Sports Day. They were amazing - they went off with their groups of older children and took part in all the activities. We loved the running races at the end! We've been using the information we've learnt about sharks to make our own information books, writing a new page each day. In our Jigsaw session, we've been looking to the future and thinking about changes and what we might do as we get older.

Elves. Another busy week in Year 1! Sports Day and the Summer Fair 2024 completed! It was so lovely cheering on our friends. In phonics we are learning new alternative sounds. In maths we have loved using the clocks to show o'clock and half past. This is again another element that you could draw your child's attention to at home when looking at what time it is. In literacy we have revisited rhyming words and wrote up a recount from our trip.

<u>Phoenixes:</u> In maths the children have been plotting data onto block graphs and in literacy they have been drafting amazing letters. We have also started our RE work on the Good Samaritan this week and have enjoyed thinking about helping others.

<u>Unicorns</u> Another fabulous week for Year 3! Not only an impressive class performance at Sports Day, which left the whole class buzzing, but also an amazing effort with our model zoo enclosures! It's has been great to see the pupils safely using proper tools and supporting each other in this real-life project! On top of all this, we have been examining the different types of angles and shapes, as well as thoroughly enjoying our class reader, *Omar (Accidental Trouble Magnet)*! Well done Year 3!

<u>Centaurs:</u> Time is zipping by in year 4. We had a fantastic trip up to the Abbey this week to see our artwork on display and the very wonderful Emily Burns gave us a hands on history session too, which we loved! We have been powering on with our light up signs in DT (no pun intended) and they are starting to really take shape and in Literacy we are editing and writing up our brilliant biographies on Edison. I was super impressed with the whole class during sports day too! I can't believe we are so close to the end of our time together, but as they say, time flies when you're having fun!

<u>Griffins</u> In year 5 this week we have continued with our science project. We investigated dissolving. In RE we have looked at religious and non religious commitments. We chose to look closely at Jude Bellingham and Taylor Swift. We discussed their dedication and sacrifices they might have made to reach the top. Then we looked at how Jewish children show commitment at a Bat/Bar Mitzvah. Super proud of all the Year 5s on Sports Day! All of our year 5s were noticeably encouraging and thoughtful towards the younger members of their team.

Gnomes This week in Gnomes we have been reading the book Toddle, Waddle', linking to our topic work. We have been making summer crafts to go on our seasons board, the children have done some brilliant paintings. We have enjoyed lots of sensory play using shaving foam and slime. In maths we have been looking at comparing groups and being able to know what is fewer then and what is more than. We have also enjoyed building on our social skills by doing activities together.

<u>Dragons</u> Another lovely week in Y6. We've got the production sorted and we can't wait to share it with you soon! Sports day was a great success and we are super proud of Y6's efforts in helping it run smoothly. Also, another huge well done to the children who organised the charity football match and to those who played. Summer fair fun too...what a week. <u>Pegasus</u> This week in Pegasus Class, our Collaboration Group have designed and made dials to add to the robots they are making. Finding Out Club explored making moving vehicles using magnets, AA batteries and tin foil. Our Literacy Group have completed their beautiful character descriptions of the girl from Wild and our Maths group began to learn about horizontal, vertical, parallel and perpendicular lines.


