In Maths we've been looking at measuring height, length and time. We've taught all the sounds for the whole year now and we're practising reading more difficult words. We had a wonderful visit from NYMAZ who played their instruments and danced as we joined in with the storytelling. Have a lovely half term break everyone.

Elves Thank you Year 1 for working so hard this half term. To conclude our South Africa topic we have made some information leaflets about why South Africa is special. We have finished these off this week. After half term we are really starting to focus in on the sounds that are needed for the phonic screening check. In maths this week we have been looking at number bonds to 10 and to 20 and seeing how if we know our number bonds to 10 this can help us work out our number bonds to 20. Great work Year 1!
