We have talked about crabs living in the sea and rockpools in Whitby and about high and low tides. In Phonics our new sound was qu and in Maths we have been revisiting the composition of 3 and 4. Sprites: Sprites enjoyed having our grown-ups join us for our Family Learning session on Monday (Thank you for coming - it was brilliant to see so many of you!). This week, we have been recognising landmarks in Whitby and finding out why Captain Cook has his own monument on the cliff top. We then used our Fine Motor and colour mixing skills to make cards of the sea with big waves and sea creatures. In RE we are starting to look at special places.

Elves Newsletter- Wow! An amazing week Year 1 completing your phonics screening checks. Everyone worked so hard and we couldn't have asked for anymore. All the staff are so proud of you!! We also enjoyed listening to instructions with the parachute and also made collages of plants with labels about what each part does. Well done!!

<u>Phoenixes:</u> Year 2 have been learning to read the time using an analogue clock. They have planted seeds for our science investigation. They have really enjoyed working on their city scape paintings.

<u>Unicorns</u> This week, the Year 3s have examined the human skeleton and have conducted an investigation to see if people with longer femurs (thigh bones) can jump further. After our experiments, we concluded that they can. We have also being looking at 12 and 24 hour clocks and have discovered why am and pm have their names. <u>Centaurs:</u> This week, Year 4 represented East Whitby at the "Big Sing" an event for schools in the area to get together and celebrate music. The children approached the whole thing with enthusiasm and energy and really showed what enjoying performance means! The children have also been working on their DT project, designing a light up sign and have been exploring circuits further in science. We even made a human circuit which was great fun!

<u>Griffins</u> Year 5 have had a busy week adding and subtracting decimals in Maths. In PE we are practising Sports Day activities in particular running and been able to pass a baton efficiently. In science we started researching properties of materials for example permeable or magnetic.

Gnomes This week we have continued to look at the book 'Errol's Garden', we enjoyed exploring herbs and lavender using our senses. We have also learnt a song with actions to help us know the different parts of a flower and how they grow. In maths we have been looking at capacity, we have used different containers during water play using the vocabulary 'full' and 'empty'.

<u>Dragons</u> It's been another busy week for year 6! We have finished our news reports on Mary Anning and have continued our work on evolution and adaption. Rehearsals for the production are in full swing and we have now made dance routines for all the songs. We also cannot wait to go on our residential next week.

Pegasus This week in Pegasus our Maths group have completed their work about money. In Literacy we have continue to think about our book Wild, the children have continued to investigate the main character, have compared the settings of the wild and the city and have considered the idea that people have rights and how this is shown through the book. In transition group we have thought about what we are looking forward to and concerned about when we think about secondary school. In Emotions Group we have continued to categorise emotions.

Happy Friday everyone! This week saw most clubs starting again, it's been lovely to see the children getting involved in it all again.
