<u>Sprites:</u> This week we've enjoyed having family in to watch our 'Little Nativity' performance. What an amazing job you all did, we are very proud of how well everyone remembered their words, sang the songs and did the actions. Thank you to our brilliant audience!

Elves Year 1 have been very busy rehearsing for their nativity this week. KS1 have completed their dress rehearsal of their nativity for the school and cant wait to share it with their families on Monday. We have had a split digraph revision week this week in phonics and we have been started our RE question 'What would we give baby Jesus if he was born in our town today?'

<u>Phoenixes:</u> The children have produced some fantastic writing this week. They have been learning about fact families in maths. They have enjoyed Christmas crafts. After the success of the Key Stage 1 Nativity dress rehearsal, they are really looking forward to performing it to parents on Monday.

<u>Unicorns</u> In Year 3 this week, we have continued comparing the Poles and exploring which animals and plant-life we might find there. We have also been working hard on our 3,4 and 11 times tables! The Year 3s have examined different ways of communicating online and how to be safe doing this, and we have investigated what the true meaning of Christmas is to Christians around the world.

<u>Centaurs:</u> our work this week has all focused on the work of the artist Wassily Kandinsky. We have looked at his abstract pieces and thought about what they make us feel, think and see, we listened to music like he did and tried to draw what we heard! We have also looked at techniques Kandinsky used for colour mixing and creating his pieces, using both water colour and oil pastel. We have imitated his work and next week will be creating pieces in the same abstract style he used.

<u>Griffins</u> This week year 5 have started writing their science fiction stories. It has been great to see all of the children's imaginative ideas - we have been blown away by their effort!

In R.E we have focused on the Christmas story and have compared the Christmas Gospels from Luke and Matthew. In Maths we looked at subtracting fractions.

This week in maths we have been looking at matching; we matched colours, shapes and made matching towers. In phonics we have been learning the sound 'k'. We have been mark making by dipping Christmas tree branches in paint. We celebrated a birthday this week too!!

<u>Dragons</u> Another brilliant and hard-working week for year 6! We have finished writing the first draft of our ghost stories and they are sounding great! In art, we have been practising our drawing and shading techniques. We also completed a reading SATS paper this week and the children did amazing!

Pegasus Pegasus loved watching their friends in the KS1 nativity this week and also watching the EYFS nativity. We have made calendars and talked about how after December a new year will start. We are continuing our stickman book in our literacy group and moving onto the 4 times table in maths. We ended the week with some Pegasus children attending dodaeball.














Panto Fun at East Whitby!
