<u>Genies:</u> This week in Genie class we have enjoyed reading Naughty bus and seeing what adventures he goes on. We had our very own Naughty bus in the classroom who kept hiding from us, and we did a brilliant job of finding him! We have been practicing our counting skills and starting to learn our nativity songs too.

<u>Pixies</u> This week we have read The Journey Home From Grandpa's and started our topic on transport. We could name lots of different forms of transport we have travelled on. In Phonics our new sound was a and in Maths we have been recognising 2 on a 5 frame. During Jigsaw Jenie time we have discussed that even though we are all different and like different things that's okay because we are all special! We may also have started learning songs for a certain show we are putting on at Christmas. Enjoy hearing them on repeat!

Sprites: Sprites have started their Transport topic this week by reading 'Naughty Bus'. We made predictions about which objects would float in water and which would sink like the bus. We then tested our predictions to see if we were right. In Maths, we've looked at ways to represent 4 and noticed that it can be made up of 4+0/3+1/2+2. In RE, we've read a story from the Bible about Moses, about him sharing rules and we've thought about the rules we have. We were lucky to have a group of fantastic musicians to do a concert for us to enjoy from North Yorkshire Music Centre.

<u>Elves</u> This week our gymnastics has moved on to making shapes. The children really enjoyed this session and we learnt lots about shapes at different heights. In topic, we have been looking at what Captain Cook did before he came to Whitby and his early life. We then made a timeline of these early events and used time adverbials to write about them. In phonics we have been looking at split digraphs. The children has picked these up amazingly well for the first time. We finished off the week with Children in Need day. Well done Year 1 xxx

<u>Phoenixes</u> Year 2 have been learning about fact families in maths. The have written a biography about the Artist Stephen Wiltshire. They have been learning about homophones. Children auditioned for parts in the key stage one nativity and we will be letting them know soon which parts they have won.

<u>Unicorns</u> what a busy week we have had! We have been investigating how the character changes in the book The Dark and then looked at how shadows are made and change depending on how close to the light source they are. We also looked at sun safety

<u>Centaurs:</u> In year 4 this week we have kick started our project on the digestion system. We looked closely at our teeth at the beginning of the week and started our tooth decay experiment. In maths we have continued with times tables and the patterns we see between multiplication and division. In PSHE we started our new project which is celebrating differences. We talked about assumptions and to 'never judge a book by its cover' All children have worked hard! Well done.

<u>Griffins</u> This week in Year 5, we have continued our work on Space and are working hard on producing a non-chronological report all about The Solar System. In PE, we are working on gymnastics and have recapped our knowledge of different shapes as well as moving onto balances. This week in Maths, we have started our unit on fractions and cannot wait to learn more!

Gnomes This week in Gnomes we have continued to look at the book 'Snow white and the seven dwarfs' and have had a go at trying to sequence the story. We have based our reflective sensory tray in the tuff spot round the story, using mirrors, pans, shiny ribbon and other reflective/shiny items while learning the phrase 'Mirror, Mirror on the wall, who's the fairest of them all'. In maths we have been looking at finding, subitising and representing 4 and 5 using different objects.

<u>Dragons</u> This week in Year 6 we have begun researching why tourists like to come to Whitby and we are combining this with several very effective persuasive techniques for our next piece of writing. It's great to see the enthusiasm the Y6s have for their home town! The pupils have now mastered BODMAS (order of operations) and have shown that they can apply their knowledge to real-life problems. We have continued with our memory tests as well, just to recall and deepen our knowledge of what we have learnt a while ago. An excellent week, Year 6.

<u>Pegasus</u> This week in Pegasus our Emotional Regulation group thought about what they can do if they're feeling scared. Our older Maths group have continued to practise strategies that support mental addition of multiples of ten to four digit numbers. Our younger group have looked at counting and addition within 20. In Literacy we completed some shared writing about Marco Polo; working on pairs or a three the children suggested sentences and then we decided how best to order these. Our Hands, Eyes and Brains Group completed their project creating patterns with quarters of circles.

Friday again and what a lovely way to end the week, all the children look fab in their non uniform and Pudsey Bear gear! We love to get involved in special days like this, there is always a buzz about the place when we do. This week we were super lucky to have a group of visiting musicians come to perform to the EYFS children, it's always great to share new experiences with the children and to see the enjoyment they get from visitors. The children have been working really hard this week and as you can see from the teachers' paragraphs, there has been some fab work produced too. Walking from class to class and talking to the children about their learning is always a highlight for us and we encourage you to talk to the children about the things they do as our children really do love to share.
