<u>Genies:</u> Our book of the week is "whatever next" and we have been talking about night time and the moon, we have even been blasting off in our very own rocket too! We've really made the most of outside this week with this lovely fresh weather, which has given us chance to explore ice as well.

Pixies: Our book of the week was 'All through the night;. We discovered that lots of people work though the night when we are asleep. Thank you to John the Paramedic for coming to visit us and talk about his job. In Phonics our new sound was d and in Maths we have investigated the number 4. We know we can make 4 in different ways and that a square has 4 sides. Thank you to all the parents who joined us on Tuesday morning, we hope you were as impressed with our new outdoor space as we are! We spent most of Thursday outside enjoying the snow day, your Pixies certainly enjoy being outside! We had an amazing day.

Sprites: Sprites have loved showing their grown ups around our fantastic new outdoor learning space this week. We got the chance to explore water freezing and defrosting and to enjoy the snow! Our focus book was 'The darkest dark' by Chris Hadfield. We talked about what astronauts might experience in space. We were lucky to have a visit from a paramedic who explained why he needs to work during the night - Thank you to John for popping in to see us.

Elves: This week year 1 have had a big focus on teen numbers. We have been recognising them, matching numeral to quantity, ordering numbers and much more. This will be continued next week applying our skills to greater than and less than within teen numbers and beyond. With the set of numbers that have gone out this week, please enjoy playing number games together, ordering numbers and hiding numbers too. In literacy, we have been gathering some lion facts and developing these ideas into a fact file. Our first dance lesson went well and we are dancing to 'I just can't wait to be king' from The Lion King.

<u>Phoenixes:</u> Year 2 have been investigating how to use the Fiction and \Non Fiction libraries. They have also been investigating the features of non fiction texts. We have started our new history project about 'The Great Fire of London'. We have started to sew our snowman glove puppet's.

<u>Unicorns</u> The Y3s have had a fantastic week, rehearsing a dance, measuring in centimetres and millimetres, working on our 6- and 8-times tables and researching for our Viking narrative. The pupils have developed a young Viking character who would be an unlikely hero, thrown into a situation where they must become a hero. Can't wait for their stories!

<u>Centaurs:</u> This week the children have been getting really into their new class texts, Podkin 1 ear and the Great Kopak tree, the latter of which has sparked some great debates about deforestation in the Rain Forests. The children have started writing discussion texts on deforestation and are really confident in sharing their views on it! In PE they are working on a dance to "The club Can't handle me" which is looking good! We also looked at the layers of the rain forest in project, it would be great to see what they can find out about the Amazin Rain forest at home too!

<u>Griffins</u> We started researching animals that live in the Himalayan mountain range to write a non-chronological report. In project we have looked a Biomes in Asia and looked at other mountains in the Himalayas. In Maths we have continued with multiplication and have been multiplying a 4-digit number by a 2-digit number. Next week we have a chance to talk to Ms Kidd's sister who has trekked to the Everest base camp. Year 5 homework this week is to think of some good questions to ask her.

Gnomes

In Gnomes we are continuing to look at space and have been putting the planets in order starting with the planet closet to the sun. In maths we have been sorting shape, colour and size. We have also been working super hard at turn taking together too

Dragons

This week in year 6, we made blood smoothies to help us understand and remember the different parts of the blood. Then we learnt about the circulatory system and how that works to transport oxygen and other things around the body. In PE, we are continuing learning the dance to Sax.

<u>Pegasus</u> In literacy our story of 'Where the Wild Things Are' continues. We have done some drama and practised our copying skills. In maths, we have looked at odds and evens and are moving onto looking at measures and using a ruler. Our performance group are really performing poems and being very expressive.

Lastly, in DT the children are working hard to sew and make a bag. Well done Pegasus

Another week done and dusted! What a funny week it has been weather wise too! We know wearing a hat, coat and gloves stops being cool once you get into KS2 but please can you encourage your children to put them on, it was -2 out there one day this week and we had to remind children to wear them!

This week there has been lots of brilliant music coming from the hall as every class works on their dance unit in PE, we will be performing these in assembly before half term so we will all get to see each other's, we can't wait and wherever possible we will pop some pictures onto class pages of either Dojo or Facebook.

This year we are having a real focus on oracy, the process of sharing and articulating ideas with each other and a wider audience, we have been blown away by the confidence some of our children have shown this week when talking about their opinions of deforestation...it was brilliant to see that they had then taken the debate home and discussed it further with their parent's too! Don't forget researching and sharing a topic of their choice will earn the children a tick towards their Gold level Pride of East Whitby award.

It was really wonderful to see so many grown ups joining our EYFS for their family learning session in our new outdoor space! We hope you loved it as much as the children and can't wait to share all the further learning that takes place out there with you all too.

Clubs got off to a good start this week (sorry that a couple had to be cancelled due to the weather). Its always lovely to hear feedback on clubs and to hear what the children would like, we know football is a popular request and are working on this in the background so watch this space! It was also fantastic to have some of the older children coming to me with suggestions for clubs they can run! If your child would like to run a lunch time club for some younger children please tell them to come and find Mrs Suggitt and we will start the process of arranging it
