<u>Genies:</u> Our book of the week was Owl Babies. We love retelling this story and know that owls stay up all night! We have also been comparing the size of the owls and can say which is big and which is little. We had lots of fun making owl sounds and wearing our owl masks.

<u>Pixies</u> This week we have read Night Monkey, Day Monkey and learned about animals that are nocturnal. We know the word means they stay up all night and also that animals that stay up all day are diurnal. In Phonics our new sound was o and in Maths we have recapped numbers 2 and 3. We have had lots of fun going on number hunts.

Sprites: This week we've been finding out more about some of our parents who work night shifts. We've looked at which animals are active at night and learnt that they are called 'nocturnal' animals. In Maths we've been getting more confident with the parts that make up 6,7 and 8 and in Phonics we've learnt how to 'chunk up' longer words to make them easier to sound out.

<u>Elves</u> Our Lion King dance is progressing really well and we are looking forward to sharing this with others in our school. During our topic time this week we have looked at carnivores, herbivores and omnivores in Africa and some classification of animals e.g. mammals, birds etc. We are finishing off our topic by creating a leaflet to tell people all about South Africa and what makes it special.

<u>Phoenixes:</u> The children have enjoyed writing diary entries about their typical day, The children have been learning their 2 times tables. They have enjoyed learning a dance routine in PE. They are looking forward to decorating their glove puppets next week.

<u>Unicorns</u> This week the Y3s have written a report on the Viking Gods and have developed and improved their Viking narratives further, too! We have been learning the differences between millimetres, centimetres and metres and how to convert from one to another, while using different tools to measure as well. We are greatly enjoying the fabulous story of The One and Only Ivan - it's very different to anything we've read before, being a story told by a silverback gorilla in a cage! A great week, Year 3!

<u>Centaurs:</u> The Y4 children have been pulling all their learning together this week with some pretty incredible information texts and Power Point presentations. They have been looking at the water cycle and thinking about how this would be impacted if the rainforest disappeared. The children have also done some awesome fact files about animals from the Amazon and drawn some great pictures to go with them! We can't wait to share all our work at the Rain Forest Café next week!

Griffins

Year 5 have had a busy week continuing on researching Everest. We looked at the challenges faced when trying to reach the summit and about what life living in the mountains is like. We began to look at Sikhism and Guru Nanak Dev Ji. In Maths we are multiplying fractions.

Gnomes This week we have been preparing to have a picnic, like the bear and owl do in the story 'Whatever Next'. The children did an amazing job at spreading butter and jam onto their bread to make sandwiches. In maths we have been subitising the number 2, we tried to recognise two objects without counting them.

<u>Dragons</u> this week, we have looked at working out percentages amounts in maths and everyone has done really well. We continued looking at the impact of exercise and diet on our bodies and have done a fantastic job of writing up our blood smoothie instructions...now we all remembered to include washing your hands!

Pegasus The stitching continues in our DT group and the poetry the children are retaining and enjoying in the performance group is astounding. We have been working on using expression and actions to really perform the poems. Cooking crew have been cooking items related to stories and narrative. So far we have decorated gingerbread men, made a fruit salad for the book Handa's Surprise, we made marmalade sandwich for Paddington Bear and this week we have made pizzas. The literacy group are now coming to the end of the 'Where the wild things are' and in maths we have been working on converting cm to mm and cm to m.

Lots of our children took part in a live online Yorkshire Water safety assembly, they were great at identifying hazards by the water and all know how to keep themselves safe too. Please talk to your children about their learning and how important it is to remember what they found out, living where they do!

You will have seen that the tarmac work on the drive and footpath is pretty much done (woohoo). However, once the carpark is back up and running, we will be reverting to the permits issued earlier in the year. If you would like to talk to us about getting a permit to use the car park, pop into the office. Please note at the moment the children are still leaving school via the road so nobody shout be using the drive at the start and end of the day.

We are heading into the final week of the half term next week and there will be lots of wonderful work to show you all, I'm sure. 
