<u>Genies:</u> we've continued to look at our family photos that you have shared thank you so much. It's been lovely listening to the children tell us who they can see. We really took an interest in cars last week so we incorporated them into provision this week and they've proven very popular! Some of our Genies helped Mrs. White harvest the carrots in our garden on Tuesday and we had a look at all the shapes, sizes and colours.

<u>Pixies</u> This week we have read Kindness Makes Us Strong and we have been talking about all the ways we can be kind to each other and how we can look after our resources too. In Phonics we have played Bertha the Bus, Bertha goes to the farm and everything she sees begins with the same sound. Check Dojo for details of a meeting to explain how I teach Phonics in nursery. In Maths we looked at more colours and enjoyed a colour hunt outside. We have also looked at the map to see our school and know that our school is in Whitby.

<u>Sprites:</u> Sprites have been sharing their 'All about me' bags this week. We've loved listening to children talking about things that are important to them and what interests them. We've learnt more sounds and read our first words! Un RE we've talked about special people in our lives.

Elves This week we are starting our new science topic about materials. We are also linking this topic with the traditional tale 'The Three Little Pigs' in literacy. In maths we have been looking at 1 less, counting backwards and whether groups of cubes have more, fewer or the same amount. In phonics we are still re-visiting phase 4 from Reception but will move onto Phase 5 very soon! Great sports session with Mr Green too! ©

<u>Phoenixes:</u> This week the children have been incredibly impressive in their PE lesson with Mr Green and have really shown us how settled they are. They have continued to think about their rights in line with "Children who Change the world!" and have though about a class charter based on the UNCRC.

<u>Unicorns</u> This week Year 3 have started to look at "What legacy the Vikings Left in Whitby" they have been focusing on who the Vikings were, where they came from and why they settled. We have started to look at our new book Arthur and the golden rope and have continued to work on our place value in Maths. Another amazing week Year 3 we are all super proud of you!

<u>Centaurs:</u> This week we have continued with place value in Maths with numbers up to 10,000. In our project we have looked at the Battle of Bosworth and have started to plan a newspaper report on it. The children enjoyed learning about the Tudor family tree. Please can we remind all children to be practising spellings and times tables at home

<u>Griffins</u> Year 5 have had a brilliant week learning all about the Blitz in WWII. We've looked at Anderson shelters, Morrison shelters and even listened to the air raid siren. In maths we have continued our work on place value and finished our biographies in English too. Thanks for sharing all the stories about family members in WWII with your children, its been lovely to hear them being told to the class!

Gnomes

We have had a lovely settled week in Gnomes this week with lots of amazing sensory activities taking place. We have really worked on our group work skills, welcoming lots of new friends into our classroom this week. Well done Gnomes, you've made a great start to the year!

<u>Dragons</u> Its been a week of amazing biking in year 6 this week with the children taking part in bike ability. Well done to all who took part. The children have hit the grown running in their maths work and are working quickly thought their place value work to start the year off. A great start by all in Y6! Keep it up.
