We've continued to enjoy both inside and outside resources, exploring shapes in the creative area, mark making using various media and our usual continuous provision. Enjoy half term Genie class!

<u>Pixies</u> Our final book of the half term was We're going on a Bear Hunt, we've really enjoyed reading this and comparing the environment to We're going on a Lion Hunt. In Phonics our new sound was y and in Maths we have been looking at 2D shapes. Have a lovely half term and I look forward to seeing you all soon.

Sprites: We've read 'The mixed up chameleon' this week. We used the story for our Drawing Club sessions and learnt new vocabulary such as 'transform' and 'camouflage'. In Maths, we've been looking at problems involving subtraction and we've learnt to recognise the maths sign -. In Jigsaw, we've thought of reasons why each and every one of us is a good friend. Have a lovely half term break and we'll look forward to our trip in the first week back!

<u>Elves:</u> In Year 1 this week we have imitated Pail Klee's picture 'Castle and Sun' and then we innovated this into our own 'Abbey and Sun' in the style of Paul Klee. The children worked well using a wash first and then more intricate painting. In maths, we have been looking at turning a half and a quarter, forwards, backwards, above and below and also ordinal numbers. The children loved the cha cha slide to help us with our listening to instructions and moving in the correct direction.

<u>Phoenixes:</u> This week year 2 have had fun reading, recording and comparing the outdoor temperature each day at 112 o'clock. They have been evaluating a range of cityscape paintings. The have produced some amazing detailed art work. The children have been working hard to recall multiplication and division facts.

<u>Unicorns</u> This week, Team unicorn have been working on their art project and are busy creating metal wire sculptures of flowers, they are twisting, shaping and joining the metal together to make individual petals and they look beautiful. In Literacy the children have continued their work on their class book "The tin Forest".

<u>Centaurs:</u> This week we continued and completed our work on Pointillism, we created some stunning pointillistic canvases of Whitby Abbey which we are incredibly proud of. <u>In fact I've just been told....they are going on display at the Abbey!!!!!!!</u> Year 4 have also been looking at time and converting between 12 and 24 hour clock times. <u>Griffins</u> Lovely week for year 5. Well done to all that ran the cross country on Monday! Children have been continuing with their artwork and used the skills they learnt last week to imitate one of Lowrys pieces of art. In science we have investigated air resistance by making different sized parachutes. We hope you all have a lovely week off!

Gnomes It's been a really settled week in Gnomes, we have completed some lovely activities together. We have used the 'naughty bus' to mark make using red paint, which links into our focus story. In maths we have been sorting different objects into 'tall' and 'short'. We hope everyone has a lovely week with their families ♥

<u>Dragons</u> This week the Y6 children have made a start on rehearsing for their end of Year performance. They all really impressed us with their auditions and organisation skills, casting was really hard! In science we are looking at electricity and have been looking carefully at circuit diagrams. In art this week the children have done some beautiful work in the style of Monet too.

Pegasus This week in Pegasus Class our Literacy have completed our books about Rivers by adding a contents page; they are all really proud of their work and really should be. They have also completed a piece of descriptive work based on illustrations from a book about the Hudson river. During Forest Skills the children collected natural resources to create collages of mini beasts. Our Times Tables group has been working really hard and are ready to move on from the two times table after the holidays.

As I am sitting writing this, I can hear Year 6 in the hall rehearsing their performance (sounds great!), that means we are speeding towards the summer! It's hard to believe another half term is over and that we now only have one half term left! Proof that as they say, time flies when you're having fun!
