<u>Genies:</u> We made our own play dough this week on Monday, and it has been a very popular choice at busy time too. Genie class have really enjoyed exploring our new reading area too and our comfy sofas. We've been reading the book 'Dinosaurs Galore' and starting to pick up some dinosaur names although they are tricky to say!

<u>Pixies</u> This week we have read Never Follow a Dinosaur and found it very interesting talking about carnivores and herbivores. In Maths both groups have talked about size using the language big, small, long, short and tall. In Phonics the new sound was d. We have also talked about trying hard in Jigsaw Jenie time and what we can do if we find something difficult. Thank you to the parents who attended our Stay and Play session. It was lovely to have you all.

Sprites: Sprites have been learning about what dinosaurs ate. We found out some liked to eat meat, some preferred plants and some ate both. In Phonics, we've 'chunked up' longer words for the first time, to make them easier to read. In Maths, we've been looking at ways to represent 6,7 and 8 and we've read 'Six dinner Sid' about a cat who lived in 6 different houses. On Thursday, it was great to have some of our parents/carers in for our Family Learning Session. We were able to show them how we use the big parachute to do big movements to strengthen our bodies, helping us to develop the motor skills we need to write.

<u>Elves</u> We hope you liked the video on our class Facebook page of our Lion King dance. It is almost completed and the children have had so much fun learning this routine. This week in maths we have been exploring adding ones to a number and also number bonds to 20. In literacy we have been writing some questions about our artist Pablo Picasso and writing down the facts that we have learnt. In art we have been practising the skills we need to be able to create our art pieces next week. This includes using shapes to create pictures, tone and experimenting with different lines.

<u>Phoenixes</u> This week the children have been writing poetry about the harbour. They have been working on developing recall for the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. They have started their local history project about Whitby's whaling past. The children who attended the gymnastics event had a great time and learnt some new skills. As always the children did a great job at representing our_school. We are very proud.

<u>Unicorns</u> What a fab week we've had this week! We have continued looking at the work of David Hockney and used iPads to create our own art work in his style. In literacy we have written some incredible monologues in the voice of the Iron Man from our class text, they really are fantastic. In maths we have been working on our bus stop division and then in ICT we have programmed the microbits to show our names scrolling across the screen! We've also squished in some Panto song practice too! It's non stop....and we love it!

<u>Centaurs:</u> This week in year 4, we have completed our balanced argument on deforestation. We have worked so hard on this piece of writing and are really proud of ourselves. We have also enjoyed researching South America and have created a double page piece on what we found out. In maths, we have started our fraction topic and are continuing to embed our times tables.

This week in year 5, we have started to look at writing a balanced argument to help us structure our debate on whether people should climb Mount Everest. We have looked more into the arguments for and against together. In Maths, we have completed work on fractions of amounts. We are so very close to finishing our Interdimensional Exploders book, which has kept us all entertained for past few weeks.

Gnomes In Gnomes this week we have been looking at the book 'Rumble in the jungle', we have explored different animals in the jungle tuff spot with natural resources. In maths we have focused on the numbers 9 10, comparing, representing and subitising. For phonics our sound this week is 'h'. For our topic work we have worked on making animal masks with oil pastels and started to create a zebra using different materials.

<u>Dragons</u> This week in Maths, the Year 6s have been investigating ratios and proportions and applying their knowledge to real-life problems. We have begun planning our final longer piece of writing for the term, a report on the functions of our heart and blood! We have now begun delving into our revision for the SAT test and I would like to say a huge THANK YOU to the parents who are helping their children at home with their Home Study Books, you really are making a difference!

<u>Pegasus</u> This week in Pegasus the children were really excited to use rollers to paint and print their block print fish. In Literacy we have finished thinking about Jack and the Beanstalk and the Gina Kaminski Rescues the Giant by comparing Jack and Gina's actions. Our Self-esteem group has started to compile lists of things they like and things that make them feel a range of emotions as part of our work on getting to know ourselves. In Collaboration Club junk modelling our robots that the children have carefully planned was well under way. In Maths we have continued developing our subtraction with exchange skills.

Friday again! Where does the time go? This week has been a really lovely week here at school with 2 groups of children heading out to represent us in the community and a fab stargazing event using the field study centre too....on that note, there are some incredibly exciting plans in place for our children and an incredible opportunity in the coming months so watch this space for some more info soon!

We have seen a big increase in the number of children reading at home over the last few weeks, it really does make a huge difference to all learning so a big thank you for your support on this. School work closely with the National Literacy Trust and other organisations around reading as we know how important fostering a love of books is.

Something we have noticed as the term continues is that there are a few children wearing trainers instead of school shoes. Please can we remind you that children should be wearing black school shoes and not trainers for the school day.
