<u>Genies:</u> We are reading the story "The first Christmas" which is all about the day Jesus was born. The Genies have enjoyed looking after baby Jesus, doing some nativity crafts and playing with the small world figures. We've had a busy time inside mostly, but we have loved watching the builders get to work on our playground, we can't wait to see it finished!

<u>Pixies</u> We have been reading the story of the first Christmas. This has helped us understand the story we are telling on stage in our Nativity. In Phonics our new sound was i and we have played 'Can you touch your...' The Pixies had to blend sounds to know which body part I was saying, for example, h-ea-d, f-oo-t, b-a-ck. In Maths we have made repeating patterns using 3 items.

<u>Sprites:</u> Sprites have been busy rehearsing their Nativity play this week and learning that Christmas is when Christians celebrate Jesus being born. We can't wait to perform our play on the stage for our grown ups on Wednesday 13th at 9.30!

<u>Elves</u> Year 1 have been working on adding an 'and' to their sentences and in maths 3D shapes. We have finished off our James Cook topic this week and are ready for our next RE topic. We will look at Christianity and the festival of Christmas. We also looked at the 4 seasons and painted lovely trees to show the four seasons. An amazing end to the week with our Christmas Fair!

<u>Phoenixes:</u> In history, the children have been learning about Whitby's Whaling Industry. In maths the children have enjoyed learning new addition strategies. The children have also been looking back at all the work they have done since September and have enjoyed creating quizzes to test their knowledge.

<u>Unicorns</u> The Year 3s this week have extended their knowledge of the Poles by taking a closer look at the North Pole and comparing this to the South. We have also researched and designed a survival guide for expeditions to the Poles! In Maths, we have established what constitutes odd and even numbers and then applied this to the 3, 5 and 10 times tables.

Centaurs: we have made it to the end of the teeth and digestion project and finished it all off with an incredibly story! The children wrote brilliantly and took their readers on an exciting adventure through the digestive system! We will be sending these to the Centre for Life! The children have been working hard in music, rehearsing the use of instruments for the carol service and have also been looking at what bullying is and understanding what tolerance and respect are in PHSE.

<u>Griffins</u> In project year 5 have started planning a Sci-Fi story and everyone's been really enthusiastic and had really imaginative ideas. We have also been comparing planet Mars to Earth and thinking of the challenges of living on Mars. We completed about DT project on bridges. Team Dark Blue's bridge held a huge 14kg! We continued with Gymnastics in PE and fractions in Maths.

Gnomes This week in maths we have looked at colour sorting with different objects around the classroom. In phonics we have looked at the sound 'c'. We have now got our class Christmas tree up and gnomes have done a fantastic job at being creative with their decorating skills! **<u>Dragons</u>** This week, lots of year 6 represented the school at the Sports Hall athletic event, they were a real credit to school and took on every challenge they faced. In school we have begun looking at the work of Paul Cezanne as part of our art project and will be producing work in his style in the coming weeks.

<u>Pegasus</u> This week in Pegasus we have been exploring the story of Stickman and joining in with the repeated refrains. We have thought of our own sentences and remembered to use full stops to finish them. In maths our group have been concentrating on multiplication and division by 3. Our dance class have learnt some super dances and are now able to pick their favourites. The agadoo is a clear favourite at the minute.

Friday again! What a fabulous end to the week, the Christmas fair was a brilliant success and we will be updating you all with how much the incredible Friends of East Whitby have raised soon, this year alone, the team have supported us in bringing the children some incredible opportunities. From Robin Windsor's dancing to Rock Kids, to buses and trips to Pantomimes in school the Friends of East Whitby have supported us every step of the way and we really are hugely grateful to them all for their dedication and hard work. There has been some really wonderful work going on in school and lots of beautiful singing filling the building as children prepare for Nativities and the Carol service. <u>A polite reminder</u>. As a school we have set hours dictated by the government. Children are required to be in school during those hours. We have an increasing number of children being collected early with no prior warning and in some cases on a regular basis. Children work right up to the last minute at school and for some being collected repeatedly early is impacting on their learning. 20 minutes a day may not seem much but that's 1 hour 40 minutes of missed learning a week. We appreciate that some medical or dental appointments will mean you need to collect early, but we do require as much notice of this as possible so class teachers can be informed and ensure the children are finished their tasks for the day in time and to ensure office staff don't have to rush round collecting children at busy points in the day.

Assisting parental understanding of autism, communication and sensory needs.

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 Unlocking Autism is a free course for parents and carers of children and young people with communication and interaction needs. You must live in North Yorkshire or your child attend North Yorkshire school or setting to be eligible. Children do not need to have a diagnosis of autism in order for parents to attend. 	a

Who is it for

 The programme includes sessions on behaviour, emotional regulation, Communication, sensory differences and autism providing practical tools and strategies to support children and young people

This is an online course which consists of five sessions which either run over two full days or as five, 2 hour webinars. It is recommended that parents/carers complete all five sessions in order to derive maximum benefit from the programme.
