Year 6 visit The Ben Kinsella Trust

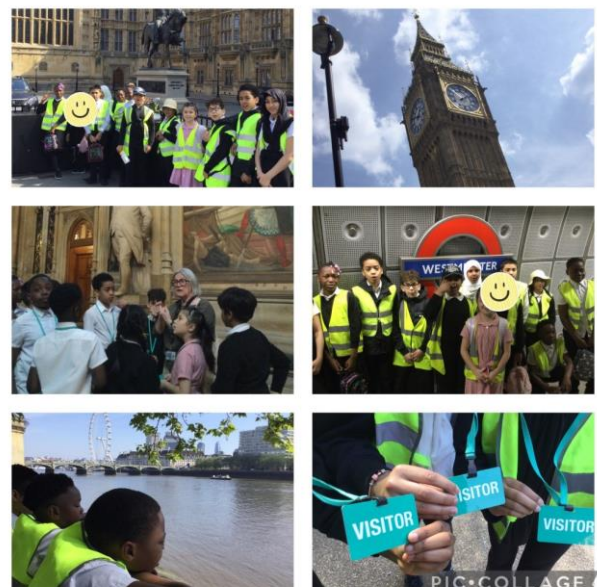
