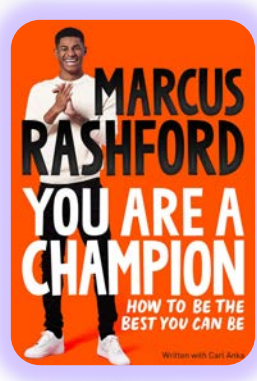
1 NEW DIVERSITY BOOKS!

3 SCHOOL COUNCIL - PUPIL VOICE

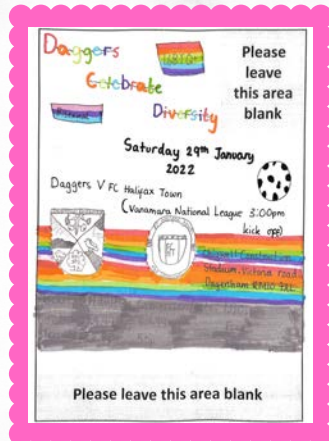
