Welcome back to a new school year! I hope you have all had a wonderful summer break with your families and a chance to enjoy some of the nice weather we had.

From walking around the classrooms, it is clear to see that the children are settling in well, especially the new Year 1 children in Miss Grocott's and Mrs Rayment's classes. They are quickly becoming familiar with our routines and are already working very hard. The enquiry question for this half term is 'What makes a hero?' The children have already started to learn about fictional and real life heroes in English and foundation subjects. At the end of every year we evaluate our successes and areas for development.
