## <u>Changing Places toilets</u> <u>In Middlesbrough</u>

Changing Places are larger than standard accessible toilets and are designed for adults and children with complex needs and include a changing bench, a hoist, a toilet, often a shower and plenty of space.

There has been a national campaign for several years to raise the awareness of the need to have Changing Place (CP) toilets for people with profound and complex needs. Too many people cannot enjoy getting out and about in their communities due to the lack of suitable facilities or have to struggle with existing public toilets. **Changing Places toilets are now available in Middlesbrough at the following locations:** 

- Bus Station
- Neptune Leisure Centre, Rainbow Centre and Middlesbrough Sports Village
- James Cook University Hospital
- Cumberland Resource Centre x2 (Linthorpe)
- The Orchard x3 (Lansdowne Road)
- Stewart Park (behind the Visitors Centre)
- MyPlace (Customs House)



A brand new Changing Places toilet has just opened at **Newham Grange Farm** in **Coulby Newham** close to the café and soft play area. Changing Place toilets should be designed to include:



- 1. height adjustable changing bench/trolley
- 2. ceiling track hoist
- 3. adequate space (3x4m) for a disabled person and up to two carers
- 4. centrally placed toilet with grab bars
- 5. privacy screen/curtain
- 6. wide paper roll to cover the bench
- 7. large disposal bin
- 8. slip resistant floor

A membership scheme is in place at the Bus Station only to ensure only people who need to use the Changing Place toilet can gain access to it to avoid it being abused. You can join the Changing Place membership scheme by taking two forms of ID to:

## Middlesbrough Borough Council's Young Commissioners

In a way to include more children and young people in the commissioning process Middlesbrough Borough Council recently recruited a group of young people as volunteers to support with this task. These young commissioners (aged 13-19) were provided the full training and support as soon as they signed up so they could hit the ground running.

After finishing their initial training in January the group jumped straight into getting involved in the recommissioning of the Advocacy Service for children and young people commissioned by the five Tees Valley local authorities. The young commissioners role was to carry out consultation with children and young people, which they did in two ways:

- ⇒ Firstly, by developing an online questionnaire which was made available via the Councils consultation portal
- ⇒ Secondly by supporting in the organising and hosting a fun event which took place during the recent February half-term; this event was held at MyPlace.

These young volunteers have already made a fantastic contribution to the work that is being carried and will continue to get involved in the commissioning of any services aimed at children and young people.

This group is open to any young person, all they need to be able to do is to communicate within a team, support workers are more than welcome to attend the group with the young people if required. Meetings take place either after school or during school holidays on days and times agreed as a group.

## Information for Parents/ Carers about the Davison Trust

Have you considered making an application to the Davison Trust?

## If you are going to apply for help with a holiday or outings during the summer you should try to send your application before the end of April.

The Davison Trust for Children is a local charity which can help children and young people living in Middlesbrough who are sick, or who are recovering from an illness or who have a disability. The Trust does not have a lot of money - but sometimes a quite small amount of money can make a big difference. The Trust tries to help people who can not get help from anyone else. Examples of help provided by the Trust include:

- Helping to pay for a holiday where the family would not otherwise be able to have a break
- Helping to pay for carpets for a family who have had to move house because their child needs special accommodation
- Helping to replace a bed for a child who has broken their bed
- Helping to fund activities and outings which will help the child to have fun and which the family could not afford.
- Helping to provide a washing machine for a family where there is a lot of washing because of the child's special needs
