**Priority 3:** COVID Response – Pupil Wellbeing / Relationships / Mental Health -Strengthen relationships, pupils wellbeing and mental health through our provision including curriculum and levels of support, in order to enhance their life Chances and outcomes.

**Priority 4: Engaging and Exciting Curriculum** – Continue to strengthen the implementation and impact of our curriculum design so that Children know and remember more; develop the whole Child through enrichments and extra-Curricular opportunities to ensure pupils are given opportunity to explore and develop interests outside the Classroom, teaching life-skills and building CharaCter.
