## **Year 3 and 4 Project Homework**

## Power of Reading: Theseus and the Minotaur.

Write a short story set in Ancient Greek times. What could happen? You could create your own characters and mythical creatures. It is up to you

Use a range of materials from home to create your own model of a mountain. Can you label different parts or add a scale? There are lots and lots of pictures online to help.

Design a mythical creature. Which animals' body parts could you include in your design? What personality will your creature have? You could draw (remember to label it!) or make your creature using junk modelling and give it a fabulous name.

The Olympics started in Ancient Greece. Time yourself doing a certain activity e.g. running 4 laps of the garden etc. and record the times over a week. Work out whether you improved over the week.

Be inspired by Greek art! Look at examples of pottery and design, or make a Greek jug or bowl. You could choose a scene from Greek mythology to represent in your artwork, but try to use colours typical of Greek art.

Design and create a model of a famous Greek building such as the Temple of Olympian Zeus, Athens. You could use junk materials found at home. Find a photograph of your chosen building to use as inspiration.



Read non- fiction books/use the internet to find out about Ancient Greece and Greek Mythology. Show your findings in creative and interesting ways (leaflet, information board, poster, fact files etc).

Find, on a world map or globe, all the exciting places you would like to visit in Greece. Which continent is Greece in? What is the climate like?

You might use digital maps to zoom in on key places before taking a 'screen image' to show the class. (Ask your adult first!)

Label a map with Greek cities and places to visit.

Research the Greek alphabet. Practise the formation when writing and how to pronounce each part of the alphabet.

Can you write an amazing fact about Ancient Greece, using the Greek alphabet?
