

# Important Notices

## Awards Super Student

Every Friday two children from each class are chosen to be super students. Where possible, this is usually one girl and one boy. Super students will be announced in class and on seesaw.

To be chosen for a super student at the end of the week your child must:

- Attend school/log on to seesaw EVERY DAY.
- Complete all work in school/online.
- Try your best!

### Homework

Half termly project homework has now gone out.

The children are encouraged to bring in or upload one piece of homework each week to share with their class.

The children will also be given spelling homework on a Friday.

### Reading at home

Please don't forget to continue to read regularly with your child at home. We upload a reading book every week to seesaw with the spelling pattern taught in phonics.

### Uniform

If your child is attending school, please ensure they wear their school uniform as normal.

### Maths

This half term the Year 1 children will be focusing on addition and subtraction within 20 and the Year 2 are learning how to multiply and divide by 2, 5 and 10.



### English

In English this term our aims are:

- To engage children with a story with which they will empathise
- To explore themes and issues, and develop and sustain ideas through discussion
- To develop creative responses to the text through drama, storytelling and artwork
- To write in role in order to explore and develop empathy for characters
- To write with confidence for real purposes and audiences

### Humanities

Our enquiry question this half term is 'What makes a habitat a home?' We are going to be exploring the Arctic and what it is like for the people/animals who live there. This half term our objectives are:

1. Exploring the Arctic Circle using a map and investigating the countries within the circle.
2. Discovering the Arctic climate by describing the difference between summer and winter in the Arctic using weather icons.
3. Identifying the physical features found in the Arctic.
4. Finding out which animals live in the Arctic and where they are found by using and reading maps.
5. Exploring different Arctic cities and the countries they are found in.
6. Comparing an Arctic town to a city in the UK.

### REVIST LEARNING

Can your child recall the seven continents and five oceans? Keep encouraging them to practise identifying them on a simple map.
