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#### Dear Parents / Carers,

We recently had a Special Educational Needs (SEND) Review by the Local Authority in school - this is something that they are doing in all Middlesbrough Schools following the last Local Authority Ofsted. Our visitors stayed in school all day and looked at our SEND provision throughout school, including our Key Stage One specialist base provision. The outcome was extremely positive! I have included some quotes taken from the Local Authority's report regarding the quality of our SEND provision:

"The school is appropriately staffed and resourced in order to ensure high quality provision and that pupils with SEND have their statutory needs met".

"The school goes above and beyond to support the significant Social, Emotional, Mental Health (SEMH) needs of individual children".

"The school has a high degree of expertise in SEND".

"The provision the school offers adopts a model of equity, in recognising that some children need more than others to achieve. SEND pupils are supported by highly skilled teachers and teaching assistants, a Care team and outreach work from partner agencies. All statutory needs are met".

"The Care Team have a significant role in ensuring SEND pupils are safeguarded and supported with their emotional wellbeing and health needs".

This report recognises and supports the work that we do here at Easterside Academy, to ensure that all Children's needs are being met. Mrs Southern our SENCO, or I, are always available to meet with any parent about their child's needs and progress should they want to meet with us.
