Topic- Volcanoes and Mountains

As geographers we will learn about mountains and volcanoes. We will investigate and explore different types of volcanoes. We will explore what happens when volcanoes erupt. Compare famous volcanoes around the world and why the ring of fire is significant.



We will research the artist Katsushika Hokusai and create our own Volcano print.

Maths

Our maths focus for this term will be ... Place value to...

- Recognise the place value of each digit in a 4-digit number (thousands, hundreds, tens, and ones).
- Partition 4-digit numbers
- Compare four-digit numbers.
- Ordering numbers
- Rounding
- Negative numbers
- Roman Numerals

Addition and subtraction to...

- Add and subtract 2 4-digit numbers.
- Estimate and use inverse operations to check answers to a calculation, teach across.
- Solve addition and subtraction two-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why)

We will sit the statutory times table test in June 2026. It is an expectation, by the end of Year 4, for children to know their times tables up to 12×12 .

For each question they need to be able to answer it in 6 seconds. That is why we need to make sure we practice!

- We ask that children regularly practise and learn their times tables. It has been proven to make a massive difference to the speed and accuracy of their calculation skills
- Reading is important so please try and listen to your child read at least three times
 a week, this does not have to be a whole book, just 5 minutes or a few pages each
 time.
- PE will be on a Monday and Year 4 will have swimming on a Friday.

Literacy

We will be looking at the book, Place Value of Grammar and punctuation unit.

This term our writing focus will be to...

- Types of Nouns
- Types of Verbs
- · Being verbs 'to have'
- Regular action verbs and verb phrases
- Irregular action verbs and verb phrases
- Sentence structure

This terms spelling focus will be

- Continuing to learn common exception words
- Use and apply homophones.
- Learning different codes that make different sounds.

This terms **reading** focus will be using Comprehension Crushers and reading plus to help us

- Apply knowledge of root words, prefixes and suffixes, (morphology and etymology) both to read aloud and to understand the meaning of new words that they meet.
- Continue to read and discuss an increasingly wide range of fiction, nonfiction, poetry, plays and reference books.
- Make comparisons within and across books.
- Increase their comprehension levels
