Year 3 have read, 'Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura to support their learning.




Year 4

Year 4 have been exploring what life was like in Roman Britain. They have had the chance to meet and talk with a real-life Roman legionary, Marinus. They have explored life as a Celt and learnt about Boudicca, the Celtic queen of the Iceni tribe. They have explored how the Romans impacted on life in Britain and how life today is influenced by the Romans!

Year 4 have read, 'Diary of Iliona' by Richard Platt to support their learning.

Year 5

Year 5 have been investigating ancient Egypt; they have explored when the ancient Egyptian's were active, whether they were savages? They have looked at the pyramids and their significance - they have investigated why Tutankhamun is so famous and who Ramesses II was. They have also explored the legacy of the Egyptians- is it just the pyramids?? They have worked incredibly hard!

Year 5 have read, 'Secrets of a Sun King' by Emma Carroll to support their learning.

<u>Year 6</u>

Year 6 have been studying the ancient Greek civilisation – Who were they? When were they chronologically active? What was life in the UK like during the same time? What is the legacy of the ancient Greeks? What do the children think is their greatest contribution to the western world? What brought the ancient Greek civilisation to an end? The children have been super busy and have produced some fantsatic work demonstrating their historical skills!



Year 6 have read, *'The Orchard Book of Greek Myths'* by Geraldine McCaughrean and Emma Chichester Clark to support their learning.





<u>MySpace</u>

Our MySpace children continue to practise their mindfulness techniques – bubble breathing and rainbow breathing helping them to stay calm and remain focused; they are becoming experts! They have also learnt to support each other with their reading through 'paired reading'; they are enjoying being able to help each other. They have continued to access the Forest Schools area, completing a myriad of different learning!


Well done everyone – you have all worked incredibly hard this term!
