We'll be continuing our 'Heroes who have changed our world' topic. After travelling back in time to meet Florence Nightingale last half term, the children will now learn about fictional superheroes.



We will....

- enjoy reading a range of stories linked to superheroes.
- use a range of sources (internet, books etc.) to carry out research about superheroes. We will also learn about how to keep ourselves safe when we use the internet to search for information.
- investigate where in the world superheroes may be from. We will learn about the different countries and their cultures, comparing them to our own.
- use maps to locate the superheroes we are learning about.
- make use of lots of mark making and writing opportunities including labels, lists, rhyming strings, captions, sentence building, fact-files.
- solve number problems in maths to unlock superheroes.
- use iPads to take photos.
- learn about keeping healthy in our PSHE unit this term: 'Healthy Me'.
- collect data about our favourite fruits so that we can design and make healthy fruit kebabs in DT.
- learn about the importance of regular exercise in our 'superhero fitness training centre' during PE sessions.
- in our role play 'superhero lair', the children will be able to take on the roles of superheroes and villains and act out narratives together.
- continue to explore different religious celebrations in RE. We will learn about the Hindu Holi festival of colour, Persian New Year and the Christian Easter festival.
- continue to work on rhythm and beat in the 'Our World' music unit. We will also continue to add to our growing repertoire of nursery rhymes.
