# Year 2

## Autumn Term 2018

# Topic

This term we will be focusing on Geography and Art skills using the text - 'The Snail and the Whale'.

## As Geographers:-

We will be asking and answering geographical questions such as -What will I see/find in this place?

We will be using world maps, atlases and globes to identify the World's seas, oceans and continents, to identify the UK and to name and locate the 4 countries of the UK and their capital cities.

#### As Artists:-

We will develop a wide range of art techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space.

- P.E. will be on a Monday and Friday this Term.
  Please make sure your child has plain blue/black shorts, white/red t-shirt and trainers or plimsolls. Could you also please try and bring P.E. kits on a Monday and we will send them home on a Friday.
- Can you also try and listen to your child read at least three times a week. This will really help your child with their fluency, pace and confidence. We will try and change your child's book twice a week. Remember asking lots of questions will check whether they understanding.

#### Math

This terms focus in maths will be:-

### Place Value

- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and words.
- Recognise the place value of each digit in a two digit number (tens, ones)
- Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations including the numberline.
- Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100: use <,> and = signs.
- Use place value and number facts to solve problems.
- Count in steps of 2,3 and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backward.

## Addition and subtraction

- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently and use related facts to 100.
- Add and subtract numbers using objects, representations and mentally including a two-digit number and ones (24+5=), a two-digit number and tens (26+10=) and adding three one-digit numbers (2+3+7=)
- Know/show that addition can be done in any order but subtraction cannot.
- Solve problems involving addition and subtraction
- Recognise and use the inverse relationship between addition and subtraction (12+14=26 26-14=12 26-12=14) and use this to check calculations.

## Multiplication and Divison

- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for he 2,5 and 10 times tables, including recognising odd and even numbers.
- Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division within the multiplication table and write them using the correct mathematical sign.
- Solve problems involving multiplication and division.
- Show that the multiplication of two numbers can be done in any order (2x5=10 or 5x2=10) but division of one number cannot.

#### Money

- Recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p): combine amounts to make a particular value.
- Find different combinations of coins that equal the same amounts of money.
- Solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change.

# Literacy

This terms writing focus will be to:-

- Develop positive attitudes towards writing about personal experiences and those of real and fictional people, writing about real events and writing poetry.
- Consider what they are going to write before beginning, saying ideas out loud and writing simple plans.
- Make simple additions, revisions and corrections to their own writing (editing) and to check their writing makes sense.
- Use capital letters, full stops, question marks, and exclamation marks correctly in a sentence and to use commas to separate items in a list.
- Write sentences in different forms statements, questions, exclamations and commands.

This terms spelling focus will be to

- Spell by segmenting spoken words into phonemes and representing these correctly.
- Begin to spell simple regular homophones (see/sea, witch/which)
- Begin to learn/spell Year 2 Common Exception words
- Learn to spell some contractions (I am ----I'm, She has -----She's)

This terms reading focus will be:-

- Apply increasing phonic knowledge to read simple/more difficult words.
- Read Year 2 Common Exception words quickly and accurately.
- Listen to a wide range of poetry, stories and non-fiction texts and express their views.
- To discuss the sequence of events in stories.
- To understand that non-fiction books are structured in different ways.
- To discuss their favourite words and phrases and explain meaning of new vocabulary.
- To check that the text makes sense to them as they read and begin to correct any inaccurate reading.
- To make sensible predictions about what might happen next based on what they have already read and what they know.
