15. <u>Software to Support Learning</u>	£4,472	12%	£537	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reading Plus – intuitive reading programme that provides bespoke reading material to support reading fluency, literal & inferential understanding, and cultural capital • TT Rock Stars – intuitive multiplication programme that provides bespoke practice of multiplication tables • Numbots – supports early maths acquisition • Showbie – this allows pupils to access support materials on their iPads directed by their Class Teacher, providing individual support. • Little Wandle Letters & Sounds Synthetic Phonics Programme – this is used to deliver both our daily phonics lessons and intervention • Big Cat Books – pupils have access to an online library of reading books, accessible both at home & in-school • Spelling Shed – supports pupils to spell • Letter Join – supports pupils with their fine motor skills & handwriting • Spag.com – support pupils with punctuation & grammar practice & consolidation
