

Pupil Premium: 2016 - 2017 Review

Our Pupil Premium Grant allocation this year is: £105,600 + £2,111.52 (EY funding)

Context:

The 'Pupil Premium' is a fixed sum of money allocated to schools to support those children who most needed additional support. It was targeted to help children overcome the barriers they faced to their learning.

Last year we had 106 children who receive the PPG. This was 39% of the school population:

Impact:

- **Attendance** - PP children are above the Government's standard of 95%. However, we need to close the gap between our PP children's attendance and Non-PP children's attendance.
- **Early Years** - we are below the National standard of 71% and our Non-PP children achieved better than our PP children. We need to close the gap between these two groups of children and also close the gap with the National standard. The EY Lead and Principal are supporting in the Reception class one morning per week and a L3 TA has been assigned to the class.
- **Year 1 Phonic Screening** - PP children are above the National standard of 81%. However, we need to close the gap between our PP children's attainment and Non-PP children's attainment.
- **KS1 SATs** - PP children are close to the National Standard in all 3 subjects. Writing and Maths are need further development and a L3 TA has been appointed to support this class. We are awaiting progress data.
- **KS2 SATs** - PP children were behind the National Standard in Reading and Maths. The Power of Reading has been introduced to improve progress and attainment in reading across the school.
